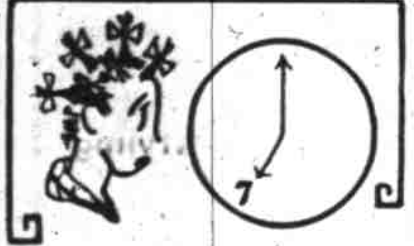
Shower Honors Mrs. Courtney

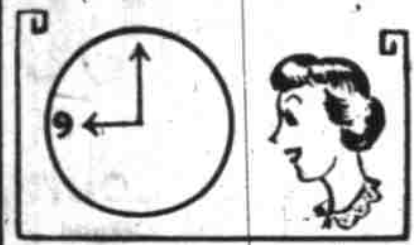

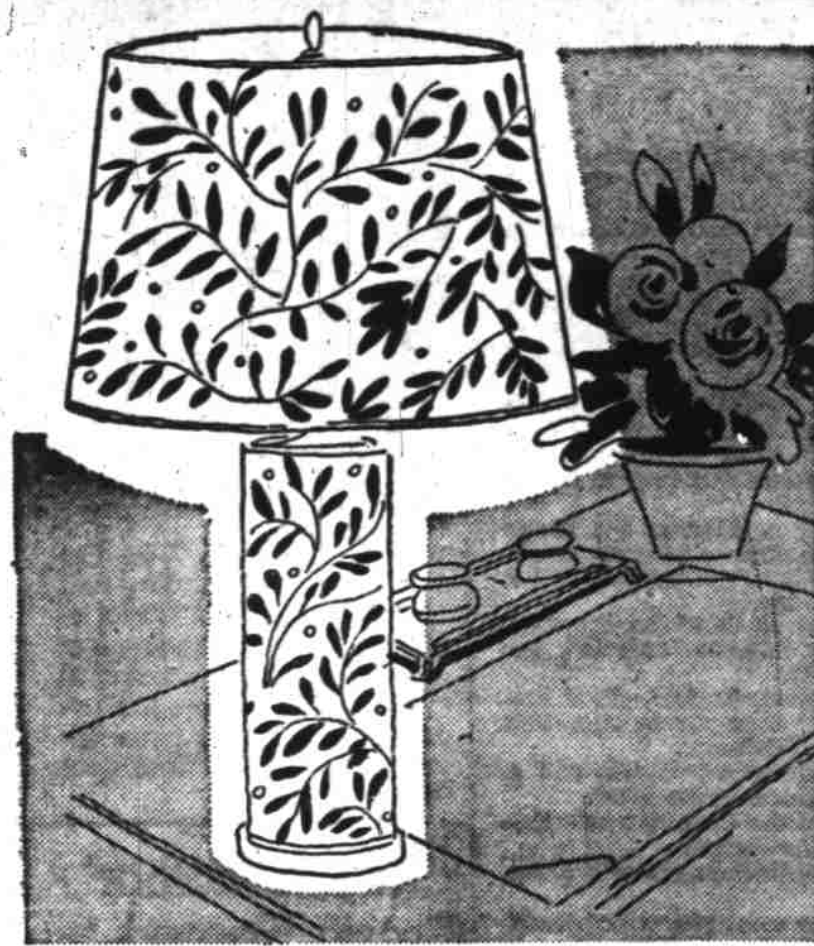
Phyllis Timm Is Engaged

THE WALLPAPER TREATMENT

It may be an old lamp, or a new one that's penny-wise but all too plain. Give it the wallpaper treatment and it can be the one-of-a-kind special you need, to match a wall or just to add dash to the room. If the shade is only glazed, wipe it off with alcohol to help the paper adhere. Sandpaper a glossy finished wood base for the same reason. Use wheat paste, which comes dry to be mixed with water, or prepared wallpaper paste. What kind of wallpaper patterns are best for lamps? The smaller patterns with

designs fairly close together, the bright little provincial prints, the finer leafy designs, traditional medallions, modern geometrics or textured effects. Marbleized and book papers are excellent for lamps and so are spatterdash papers and plaids.
