Rail Crossing Accident Suit Asks \$35,465

A suit seeking judgment of \$35,465 for damages allegedly incurred in a train-auto collision on March 13, 1948, on Lancaster drive east of Salem, was filed here Saturday.

The suit was filed in Marion county circuit court by John Schukart against P. C. Gerousbeck, E. E. Bentley and Dale Fields, conductor, fireman and engineer of a Southern Pacific freight train.

Schukart alleges the train consisted of empty flat cars and that they could not be seen at the crossing in the dark. It was raining, he said, when his car crashed into the train at about 11:15 p.m.

The complaint alleges the railroad employees were negligent in operating the train because it could not be seen clearly, they failed to "give any warning" on approaching the crossing and failed to keep a proper lookout.

Schukart said there was no warning signal at the crossing. The plaintiff alleges he was injured and his car demolished.
