The stepfather, Frank Chase, \$2, was arrested last August after \$9-year-old Henry Chum, an amputee war veteran, was found in his home in serious condition.

Deputy Prosecutor Orville Peebles said Chum had large bruises on his body which he said had been inflicted by the stepfather during a series of beatings.

A suit was later filed against Chase, asking the return of \$3,968.05, which he allegedly took from Chum. This represented \$2,768.05 which the veteran had received for disability pension and an automobile the older man had taken from his stepson and sold. The automobile was a gift from the government to Chum because he was an amputee.

Prosecution of the charges against Chase was delayed while he was treated at Western State hospital the last four months. He was released a week ago and the sanity hearing ordered.

Chum now is working as a logging truck driver. Bail for Chase has been set at \$5,000.
