March Goes Out Like Lamb In Salem Area

It wasn't particularly hot—only 63 for a few minutes—but Friday was the hottest day of March.

The previous high was set last Wednesday when the thermometer registered 63. Low for the month was a 26 back on the 7th, McNary field forecasters revealed Friday night after a check of the month's figures.

Other monthly weather data showed that there wasn't one single clear day and only four partly-cloudy days during March. The remaining 27 were classified as cloudy.

Exactly 4.86 inches of precipitation fell, about 3 more than normal. This included rain, hail and snow. The largest single down-pour drenched the area on the 16th and 17th with 1.77 inches in 24 hours.

The mean temperature for March was 44.8, about 1.7 below normal. There were 10 days with minimums of 32 or below. Prevailing winds were southerly.

Children Keep City First Aid Squad Busy

Youngsters kept the Salem first aid squad hopping from block to block a particularly busy two-hour stretch Friday morning.

First two-year-old Michael Smith, who lives at 549 N. Cottage st., got a piece of candy caught in his throat and almost choked. First aid men credited his mother with possibly saving the lad's life by pounding his back sharply and dislodging the obstruction.

Then five-year-old Carl Wilson, son of Mr. and Mrs. Claude Wilson, 822 N. Commercial st., fell down the steps of his home. He required several stitches for a scalp wound and was treated at Salem General hospital.

Finally, Gwen Klinge, 12, daughter of Mrs. Leona M. Klinge, fell down the steps at Grant school and incurred a possibly fractured hip. She was taken to Salem General hospital and was confined Friday night pending X-ray examination.

Acheson Says Lattimore No Policy Director

WASHINGTON, March 31 - (AP) Secretary of State Acheson denied today that Owen Lattimore, whom Senator McCarthy has called a Soviet agent, is the actual director of American policy in the Far East.

Answering a volley of questions at his news conference, Acheson also said:

"That Lattimore never has been employed by the department.

"That he doesn't think he has even met Lattimore.

"That Lattimore's contacts with the state department have been limited to a few occasions.

"That he has been informed Lattimore never had a desk in the department.

"McCarthy's office said the senator has given documents to the FBI to prove that Lattimore was a Soviet agent who was getting instructions from Moscow as long ago as 1936.

HONG KONG, March 31 - (AP) Russian planes are patrolling North China sea routes for the communists and Russian aircraft carriers and garrison troops are swarming into North China cities, American shipping sources reported today.

Grand Jury Advises City Jail to Improve Sleeping Equipment

Bedding and ventilation at Salem's city jail drew a below-standard rating from the Marion county grand jury Friday morning.

The jurors stressed that their report was not a criticism of the Salem police force, however.

The report was filed with the county clerk following inspections of the city jail, the county jail and Oregon state penitentiary. The latter two received satisfactory reports.

"If a person is innocent until proven guilty there no doubt are persons detained at the city jail who are entitled to better sleeping equipment," the report stated.

At present a steel cot and blankets are provided, according to the report.

Immediate installation of a ventilating system also was recommended, if funds were available. "It was stated on authority that this would be done shortly."

"The ventilation (at city jail) is especially bad," the report continued.

"Fresh air is admitted through one small window 10 or 12 feet above the floor.

At Marion county jail the grand jury found "clean and sanitary premises, food kept and served under well-regulated conditions."

The sheriff's office was commended in view of the quarters it had to contend with. It was noted that undesirable features will be eliminated when the new court house is erected.

The management at Oregon state penitentiary is making every effort to make the institution above standard, the grand jury reported.

Jurors found inmates "well disciplined," employees "attentive to duty," the prison hospital "in excellent condition" and food "prepared under sanitary conditions."

"Classes of instruction including aptitude tests have been established to assist the individual to retain his place in society after his release," the report stated.

State police were searching for clues early this morning to the theft of an auto Friday evening which was discovered abandoned shortly before midnight at Lake Labish on the Pacific highway.

The auto was stolen from R. H. Trueax of Monmouth while he was visiting a friend, Lloyd Prathers, at Buena Vista. A .22 calibre rifle was missing from the auto when it was discovered by police.

THE HAGUE, The Netherlands, March 31 - (AP) - A move is under way among North Atlantic Alliance powers to bring Spain into the defense system indirectly through lease of Spanish airfields, well informed sources said today.
