Jobless Benefits Increase Asked

WASHINGTON, April 6—(P)—President Truman asked congress today to authorize bigger jobless benefits to more people for a longer time.

He sent up a special message saying that unemployment compensation checks ought to:

1. Run up to \$30 a week on a uniform scale over the nation, plus additional money for dependents.
2. Be forthcoming, if needed for 26 weeks.
3. Be made available to an additional 6,000,000 persons not covered by present law.

House Democratic Leader McCormack immediately introduced legislation to carry out the president's program.

Citizens Urge Permanent Abiqua Dam

SILVERTON, April 6—A special citizens committee today recommended that permanent-type dam be constructed on Abiqua creek to solve Silverton's water supply problem.

The committee suggested the dam be located at the site of the old dam which washed out in 1942. The specifications would be decided by the city council and planning commission.

The report will be submitted to the city council and planning commission during a special meeting Monday night at the city hall. The citizens committee was named last January by the council and Mayor Errol Ross to study the local water system which has been termed "deplorable."

The water problem has been controversial here since the old dam washed out. Because of a material and labor shortage, a pumping system was installed at that time. The temporary measure, the committee stated, has proven expensive and unsatisfactory.

A proposal to issue bonds to build a new dam was defeated in an election last spring. The citizens committee also recommended that the city manager be instructed to draw plans for the dam and supervise its construction.

100 Perish in Train Wreck

RIO DE JANEIRO, Brazil, April 6—(P)—A little wood-burning passenger locomotive plunged through a bridge in the darkness early today and dragged perhaps 100 persons, many of them Easter holiday travelers, to death in the flooded Tangua Dos Indios river. The estimate of 100 dead came from the police chief of Tangua, who led the first rescue party to the scene north of Rio de Janeiro. He said more than 200 were injured, 40 of them in wooden coaches which were jackednifed by the crash but stopped short of the river.


