

Stadter Seeks Court Order to Destroy Gambling Equipment

Marion County District Attorney Edward O. Stadter, jr., said Thursday he would seek a circuit court order to destroy slot and pin-ball machines seized in recent gambling raids.

Circuit Judge George Duncan quashed an attempt of a group of men to delay destruction of 15 slot machines seized in a raid last July 6 on the Salem Eagles lodge.

When the case was heard in the court of Judge Alf O. Nelson of Silverton he issued an order directing the sheriff to destroy the machines. The men, who were directors of the Eagles lodge at the time of the raid, petitioned the higher court for a writ of review of Nelson's order. This petition Judge Duncan denied Thursday.

Stadter said he would apply for a court order to destroy not only the Eagles' machines, but several others. These include a machine taken from Harley Cordray, a pin-ball machine taken from Earl Layman at Detroit and gambling equipment and cardmaking tools seized in a raid at Detroit several months ago.

Five more naval air reservists, third group in a training series, have started a two-weeks training course at the Salem naval air facility, it was reported Thursday.

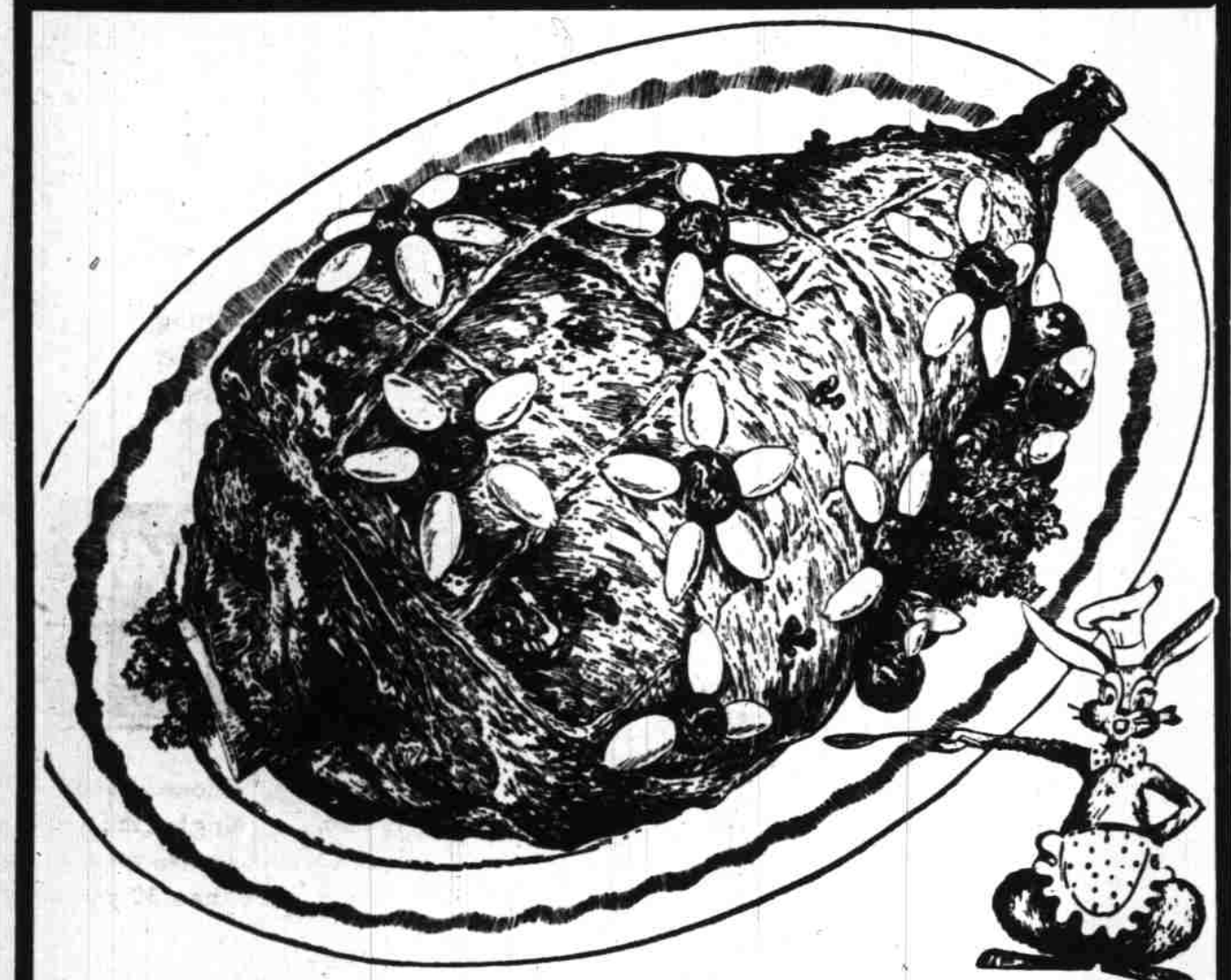
