

Churches of Mid-Valley Area Prepare For Presentation of Easter Services

Early Services, Breakfasts Due For Silverton

SILVERTON, Apr. 7—Through-out Silverton churches special services have been arranged for Easter Sunday. Many churches are holding sunrise services followed by breakfast.

At First Christian church Evangelist B. Ross Evans and Mrs. Evans will begin a three-weeks meeting, starting at the 11 o'clock service. Evans will speak on "Christ and the Resurrection." Mrs. Evans will be soloist. The choir, under the direction of P. T. Poybhart, will sing the cantata, "The King Triumphant," Sunday night at 7:30.

Luther league of Calvary church will sponsor an Easter breakfast in the church at 8 o'clock. The Sunday school program will be at 10 a.m. The Rev. P. W. Erikson of Salem will give the morning sermon.

At Christian Missionary and Alliance church, the Sunday school under the direction of Oscar Sattum, will present a special program at 10 a.m. and the Rev. Gordon T. The Holy Week Story

The Lord Is Risen



(Sixth and last of a Holy Week series by AP Newsfeatures. Art from the painting by Gustave Dore. Text condensed from Luke 23 and 24.)

A man named Joseph, a counsellor, of Arimathea, went unto Pilate and begged the body of Jesus. He took it down and wrapped it in linen and laid it in a sepulchre that was hewn in stone, wherein never man before was laid.

The women which came with Him from Galilee followed after and beheld the sepulchre and how His body was laid. They returned and prepared spices and ointments and rested the sabbath day.

Now upon the first day of the week, very early in the morning, they came unto the sepulchre, bringing the spices. And they found the stone rolled away from the sepulchre.

They entered in and found not the body of the Lord Jesus. As they were much perplexed thereabout, two men stood by them in shining garments. As they were afraid and bowed down their faces to the earth, they said unto them, "Why seek ye the living among the dead? He is not there, but is risen. Remember how He spoke unto you when He was yet in Galilee, saying, 'The Son of man must be delivered into the hands of sinful men and be crucified, and the third day rise again.'"

They remembered His words and returned from the sepulchre and told all these things unto the eleven and to all the rest. Their words seemed to them as idle tales, and they believed them not. Peter ran unto the sepulchre and beheld the linen clothes laid by themselves and departed, wondering at that which was come to pass.

And Jesus himself stood in the midst of them and said, "Peace be unto you." But they were terrified and supposed that they had seen a spirit. He said unto them, "Why are ye troubled? Behold my hands and my feet, that it is I myself. . . ."

"Thus it is written and thus it behooved Christ to suffer and to rise from the dead the third day, that repentance and remission of sins should be preached in His name among all nations, beginning at Jerusalem. And you are the witnesses of these things."
