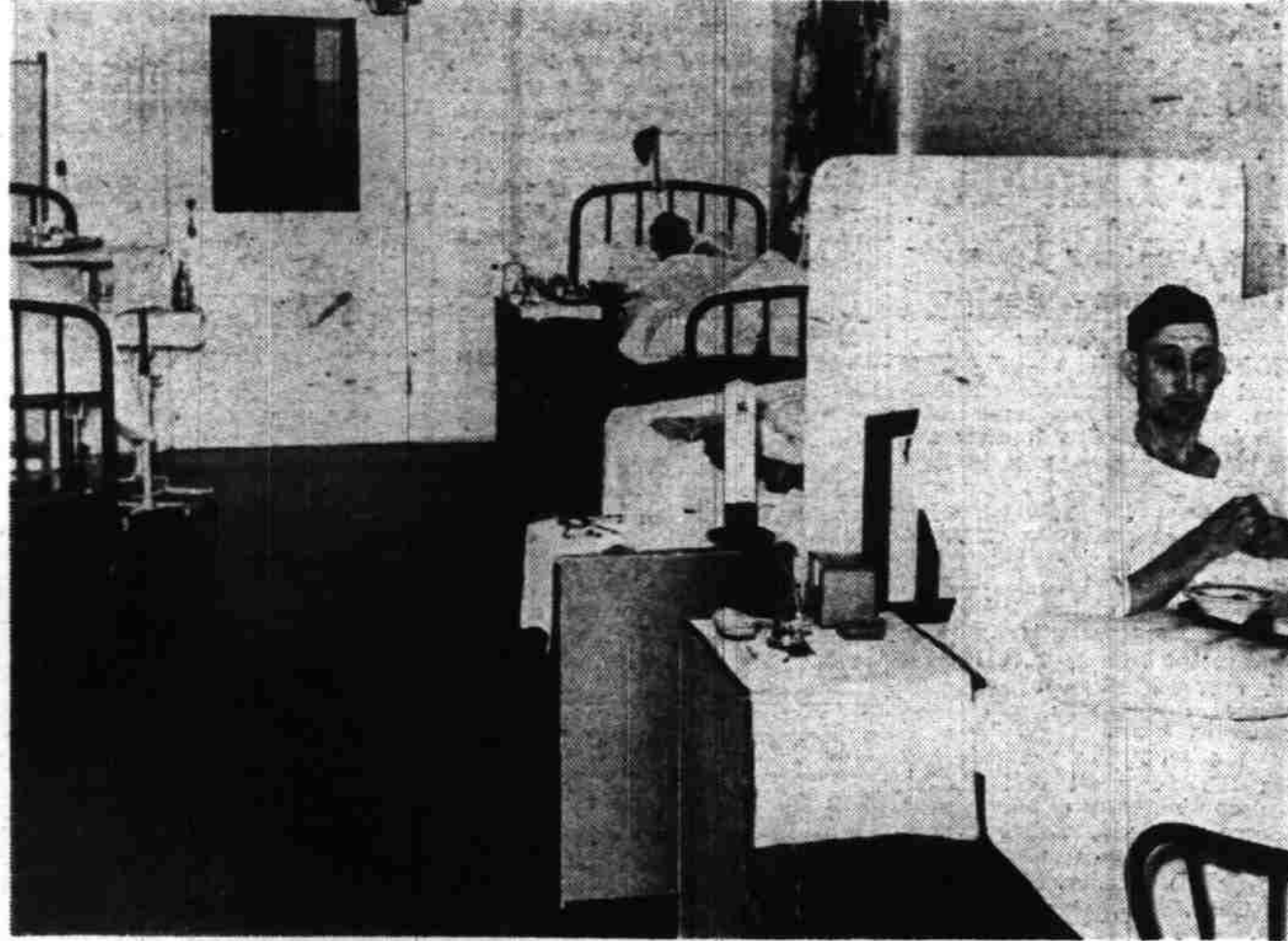
Rep. Hugh D. Scott (R-Pa) who resigned as GOP committee chairman last August because of pressure within the party, said in an interview:

"Although Eisenhower doesn't want to run, I don't think he will be able to resist. I think the general, who is a good soldier, would submit to a draft just like any good G. I. would."

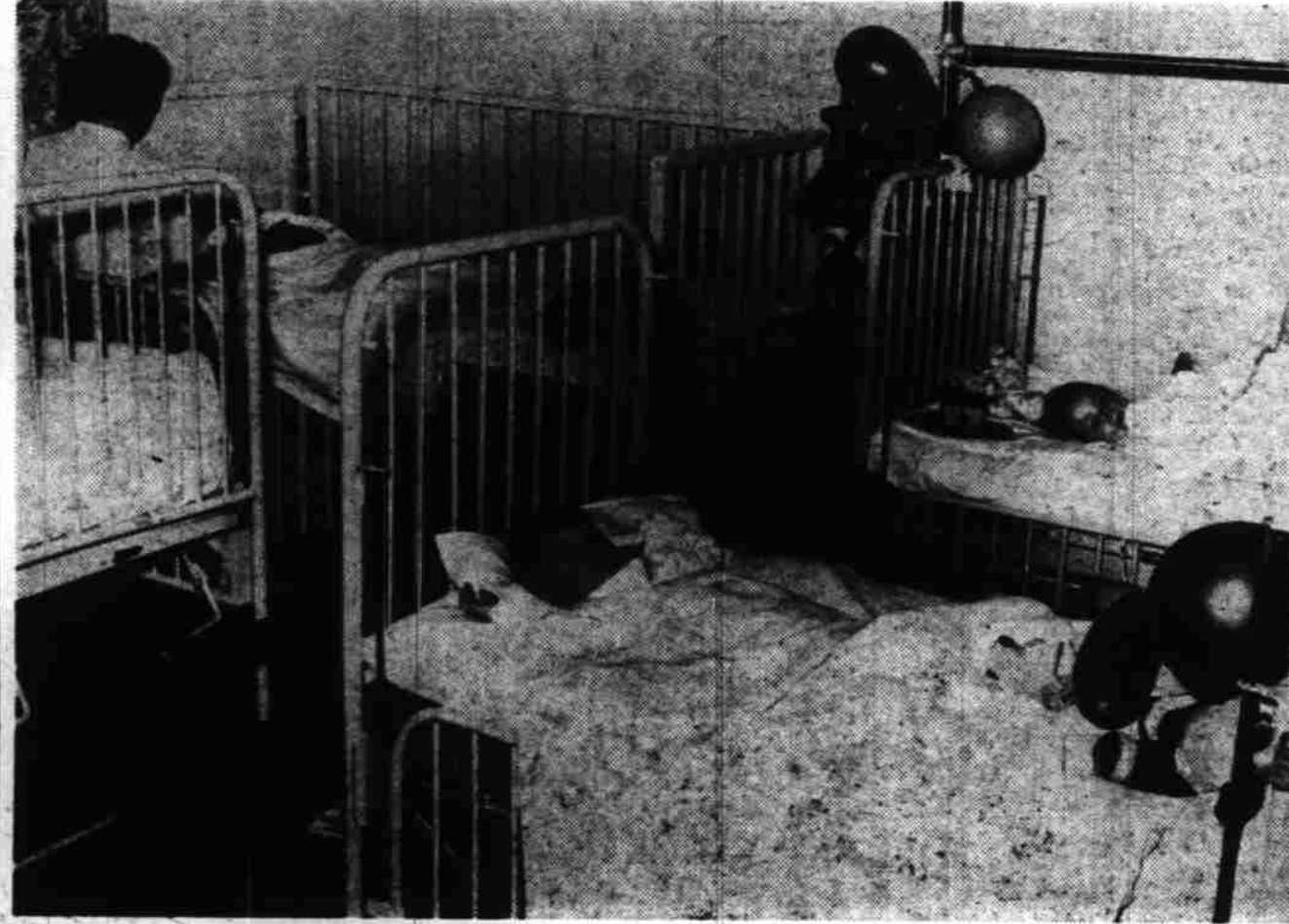
People, Scott said, "are tired of President Truman's loud talk, loud shirts and loud scandals."

### Jammed Hallways, Wards Show Need for Added Hospital Rooms

If any more space for hospital beds can be found, it will be used. This children's ward at Salem General hospital is jammed, as the photo shows. Hospitals provide the best care possible but there is a limit to space and equipment.

Construction of the new Salem General hospital may start within two months if a current fund drive raises an additional \$90,000 spokesmen for the Salem Hospital Development program said Friday.

The program must have about \$500,000 in cash or pledges to

quality for federal funds at the rate of 50 cents for every dollar raised here.

Of funds raised thus far, \$100,000 has been spent for improvements at Salem Memorial hospital. Memorial also will receive 9 per cent of future subscriptions.

Facilities at both hospitals have been overburdened for many months with some patients bedded in corridors.

The architect for the new hospital, Carl A. Erikson of Chicago, is expected to arrive in Salem in about 10 days.
