Bull Market Moves Stocks To New Highs

NEW YORK, April 12 -(AP)- The bull stock market got back in the groove today after Tuesday's upset and reached a new 31/2-year peak.

Final prices were up fractions to an extreme of around 3 points. The only time during the day that the market showed any indecision was at the opening, when heavy trading produced only minor price changes. From then on the direction was forward although progress at times was Closing quotations were slow. tops for the session in most cases. Hard-hitting demand for aircraft stocks started the market rolling ahead. Buying power soon spread into other groups including

the reluctant rails. A notable angle of the market's pattern was the pink-up in interest in low-priced shares. Of the 15 most active stocks, only five sold about \$20 a share.

Trading was fastest in the morning and again in the final hour. Sales piled up to 2,010,000 shares. exactly even with Tuesday and the fourth time in a row that business in a full session has totaled 2,000,000 or more shares.

The Associated Press average of 60 stocks moved up .7 of one point to 76.2, a peak since Aug. 20, 1946. Only the rail group failed to reach a high for two or more years although the gap was a small one.
