

Salem Women Will Attend Conference

The Salem branch of the American Association of University Women will be represented at the Oregon state division conference of AAUW at Bend on April 21 and 22. Miss Eleanor Stephens, member of the local branch and historian for the state division, is scheduled as one of the featured speakers at the conference. Miss Stephens will give the address at the banquet meeting April 21 and will discuss the "History of the Oregon Division."

The local branch will receive recognition for its fellowship program at the conference as it is one of five branches in the state which has recently awarded a study grant. The group sponsored the Beryl Holt study grant which was awarded this year to a Japanese woman for study in this country. The local branch has also been selected to report at the conference discussion on "Outstanding Programs in the Oregon State Division."

Before starting her present work with AAUW two years ago, Dr. Morrison served as research assistant to two of America's specialists in international law and held other important research and government posts. In the summer of 1948 after accepting her AAUW post Dr. Morrison went to England for the council meeting of the International Federation of University Women.
