New Jersey Town to Erect Paine Statue

MORRISTOWN, N. J. (INS)—The first heroic statue in the nation to the memory of Thomas Paine will be erected in Morristown, N. J. next July 4. Morristown was selected as the site by the Thomas Paine Memorial committee because nearby was located Washington's Revolution headquarters, which is now a national shrine. It was at this spot that Paine wrote his famous "These are the times that try men's souls." Paine read his immortal Crisis Papers to a group of discouraged soldiers serving under Washington and inspired them to continue the fight for freedom and independence.

Search for Drum
One of New York's architects, George Lober, was commissioned to do the fourteen feet high bronze memorial. Lober spent in a many months doing research work before starting the statue to be sure everything connected with the work was authentic. He searched for three months for an American drum of the Revolution period. Lober depicted Paine seated upon a large rock, with a musket across his knees, composing the Crisis Papers upon a drum. Lober needed a drum for a model and though there were many English, French and Hessian drums around he had trouble locating an American drum.

Picnic Planned
The statue, which will rest upon a granite base, will be placed in a beautiful park which is also newly created. It will be landscaped for outings and picnics in a many ways. The city of Morristown is going all out in honoring and commemorating the erection of the statue. For weeks and months prior to the unveiling there will be parades, speeches, contests among school children, and various other civic events honoring Paine's memory.

There is only one other statue of Paine in the world and that is located in Paris where he wrote the Constitution and Bill of Rights during the French Revolution. For that he was made an honorary citizen of France.

The greatest living authority on Paine is Joseph Lewis, the executive secretary of the Thomas Paine Memorial committee. It was entirely due to his efforts that the American patriot was recently included in the Hall of Fame.
