O'Doul Join Haney as Fashion Leader

SACRAMENTO, Calif., April 20 (AP)—First came Fred Haney, O'Doul of the Hollywood Stars, with his idea of briefs for baseball players.

Now it's San Francisco's Lefty O'Doul. The Seals pilot is set to put on display here Saturday evening a free-wheeling knit jersey he has conceived to take the place of the traditional sweatshirt and undershirt of the baseball uniform.

The idea of the jersey, O'Doul explains, is to give hitters freer motion in the shoulders, permitting them to take a more uninhibited cut at the ball.

The jersey is a slipper affair with a three button partial opening from the neck. It has short sleeves and collar with points of conservative length.

Let Haney provide the shorts to speed up the men who rely on quick legwork to beat out squibbers, O'Doul reasons.

He wants to unshackle the batters who can sock the ball to the fences so that they will have that extra push to clout it over.

O'Doul said his team will suit up in the road version of the jersey for Saturday's night game with Sacramento.

He said he would have held the spring showing of the new togery while the Seals were at home, but the manufacturer had a little trouble making white jerseys to match the home uniforms.

There seems to be some question as to whether Haney or O'Doul went first to the sporting goods people with style sketches.

But both pilots agree baseball is ripe for a sartorial change.

More Openers On Day's Sked

Yanks to Be Feted For 1949 Campaign

NEW YORK, Apr. 20 (AP)—Rain and cold weather took care of most of the major league baseball slate for Thursday, but two games were played, one in each league.

In them the Pittsburgh Pirates lashed the St. Louis Cardinals at St. Louis, 8-4, to cop the series 2-1, and the Detroit Tigers nosed out Cleveland for the second straight time, 5-4.

All other games were postponed. They included (American league) New York at Boston and St. Louis at Chicago, (National league) Boston at New York, Brooklyn at Philadelphia and Chicago at Cincinnati.

Almost all teams are ready for more home openers tomorrow. Yankee stadium will be jumping with notables when the world champion open their home season against the Washington Senators.

Among those present will be Governor Thomas E. Dewey, Baseball Commissioner A. B. Chandler, and Margaret Truman, daughter of the president.

But none of the three has been asked to pass out the first ball. That distinction has been given to 83-year-old Edward Grant Barrow, the man who founded the modern Yankee championship dynasty.

Barrow, before his retirement six years ago as general manager of the Bombers, led the club to 14 American league flags and 10 world championships.

Toski, Demaret Lead Cavalier

VIRGINIA BEACH, Va., April 20 (AP)—Bob Toski, an almost shy professional golfer who won the army all-American open in India in 1945, served notice today he expects to cause favored Jimmy Demaret plenty of trouble in the Third Annual Cavalier Specialists Golf tournament.

Toski, of Northampton, Mass., sailed around the 6,065-yard Cavalier Yacht and Country club layout in four under-par 65 as an 18-hole pro-amateur event opened this four-day duke's mixture of golf.

Demaret, displaying the same red-hot putting that won him the Augusta Masters and the North Fulton Open at Atlanta in succession, fired a 65, too. So did Laney Jim Ferrier, the transplanted Australian from San Francisco.

Toski teamed with W. W. McClannan, Jr., of Virginia Beach, to win the pro-amateur honors. The two posted a best ball score of 61, eight strokes under par.

The low scores turned in by Demaret and Ferrier were expected and gave indications they may stage another dogfight resembling the Masters play during the \$10,000, 54-hole medal competition here Saturday and Sunday.
