More Home Openers On Schedule Today

Commissioner Chandler will present each member of last year's squad either with a watch or a ring, according to individual choice. Manager Casey Stengel will pull up the 1949 championship flag.

Six other clubs, meantime, also will celebrate their home openers with parades to the flagpole and other familiar trappings. Boston's Red Sox, jolted two out of three by the Yanks on their home grounds, move down to Philadelphia for a set with Connie Mack's Athletics, while Detroit plays host to the Chicago White Sox.

Only the three games are scheduled in the American League, as the St. Louis Browns have put off their home debut against Cleveland until Saturday, with a double-header Sunday.

The Boston Braves, having slugged the New York Giants twice in a row at the Polo Grounds, can look forward to an enthusiastic reception from the home folks when they square off against the Phillies in their 1950 debut at Braves field.

National League observers gained new respect for Billy Southworth's sluggers in watching them roundly outpitch and outhit the remodeled Cincinnati Reds. Now is that they will be very much in the race. The cooled-off Giants cross the East river to engage their favorite foe, the Brooklyn Dodgers, who broke even in their opening pair with the Phillies.

The St. Louis Cardinals move into Chicago for a look-see at Frankie Frisco's lively young Cubs, while Cincinnati supplies the opposition in the Pittsburgh Inaugural.

Little Murry Dickson set down his former Cardinal teammates today on six hits for the Pirates. One of the blows was Stan Musial's second home run of the season.

The Pirates hopped on Howie Pollet and four relief pitchers for ten safeties, including home runs by Ted Beard and Jack Phillips.

Ted Gray, young Tiger left-hander, also came up with a six hit in downing Cleveland. The Tigers jumped on Early Wynn for three runs in the first inning with Pat Mullin highlighting the rally with a two run double. The Tigers clinched the game in the fifth with two unearned runs on Wynn's error.

Gray hit Manager Lou Boudreau on the left elbow with a pitch in the ninth and Rookie Al Rosen followed with a homer before Gray got the side out. Boudreau left the game but the extent of his injury was not determined.

The river was still a couple of feet high for "just right" conditions but a few nice fish were taken and Mrs. Goin' After 'em wiped your fishing editor's eye as usual. Have to keep her happy. She caught a pair of steelhead, one of which was a bright fish evidently part of the early April run. The other was a racer and was returned unharmed, so it could make its return to the sea and come in again next winter a much larger specimen.

Talked with F. H. Sumner, game commission man at Sand Lake, Ore., who was taking a creel census on the Nestucca. Sumner stated that although not many fish were taken from there over the week end, those that were caught were of good size. Some of them hit the 20 inch mark. We took one 18 inches with the rest of the bag running from 10 to 12 inches. The Yaquina was good on Saturday but turned sour on Sunday when the water clouded up. Some very large cutthroat were taken near Elk City on the troll.

Steels Were Getting Into the Act Too Much
 Five rivers in the Alsea area produced some nice catches on Saturday and some of the boys complained about losing too much gear on steelhead. Rarely do we hear of an angler complaining because the fish are too big but such was the case with some of the Five Rivers anglers. They wanted trout and the steelhead would not leave them alone. Kept taking their outfits before the trout had a chance.

Coast fishing should remain good until about the middle of May when it can be buttoned up until the return of the cutthroat in late July. Take a boy or girl fishing, and good luck.

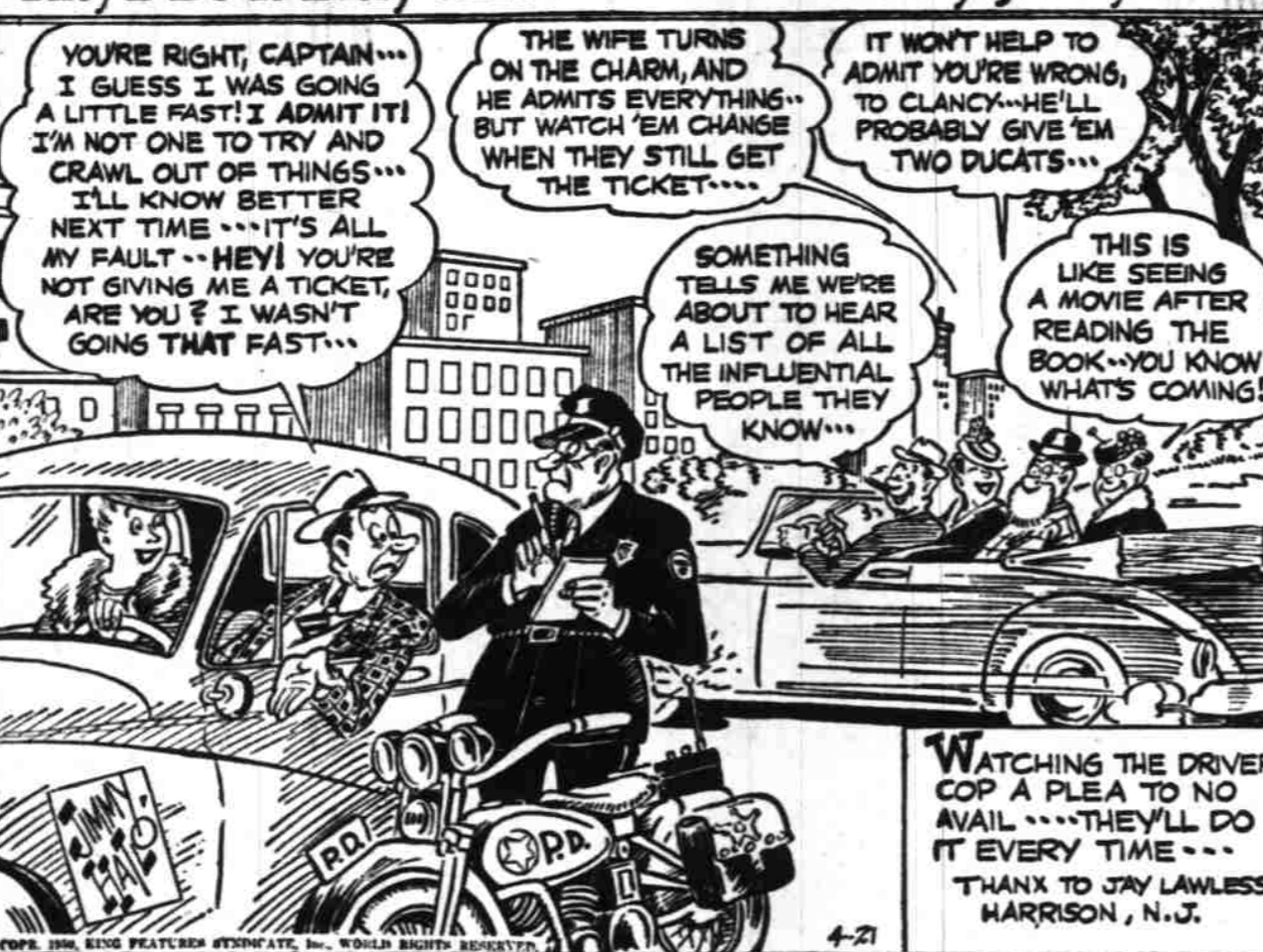

EUGENE, Ore., April 20. — (AP) — Idaho won its first Coast conference northern division game here today, outslugging Oregon in a wild contest, 17-12. Idaho pounded five Oregon pitchers for 16 hits, and was further aided by numerous walks and five Oregon errors.

First Baseman Bob Pritchett led the Idaho hitting, collecting four singles and batting in three runs. Second Baseman Tobie Masingling had a triple, a double and a single. Outfielder Joe Zavetsky hit a home run with none on base in the fourth.

Catcher Joe Sugura of Oregon also hit a home run. It came in the first inning with one man on base. Sugura's blow started Oregon off to 4-0 lead before Idaho could get going in the fourth. Then came Zavetsky's round-tripper, and the Oregon pitchers couldn't get Idaho out after that. The biggest inning was a nine-run burst by Idaho in the sixth.
