

The Bible Story

JEREMIAH

Why is this people of Jerusalem slidden back by a perpetual backsliding? They hold fast deceit, they refuse to return. The wise men are ashamed: they have rejected the word of the Lord; and what wisdom is in them? For every one is given to covetousness, from the prophet even unto the priest every one dealt falsely. For they have healed the hurt of my people slightly, saying, Peace, peace; when there is no peace. I will surely consume them, saith the Lord; and the things that I have given them shall pass away from them.

The Lord our God hath put us to silence, and given us the water of gall to drink, because we have sinned against the Lord. We looked for peace, but no good came; and for a time of health, and behold trouble. For the hurt of my people I am grieved: is there no balm in Gilead; is there no physician there? why then is not the health of my people recovered?

Behold, the days come, saith the Lord, that I will make a new covenant with Israel. I will put my law in their inward parts, and will be their God, and they shall be my people. And they shall teach no more every man his neighbor, and every man his brother, saying, Know the Lord: for they shall all know me, from the least of them unto the greatest of them saith the Lord: for I will forgive their iniquity, and will remember their sin no more.

In that time, saith the Lord, the children of Israel shall come, weeping: they shall seek the Lord their God.

My people hath been lost sheep: their shepherds have caused them to go astray. All that found them have devoured them: and their adversaries said, We offend not, because they have sinned against the Lord, the habitation of justice, the hope of their father: And I will bring Israel again to his habitation. In those days, saith the Lord, the iniquity of Israel shall be sought for, and there shall none: for I will pardon them whom I reserve. Is it nothing to you, all ye that pass by? behold, and see if there be any sorrow like unto my sorrow, which is done unto me, Zion spreadeth forth her hands, and there is none to comfort her. Behold, O Lord, and consider to whom thou hast done this.

It is of the Lord's mercies that we are not consumed, because his compassions fail not. The Lord is my portion, saith my soul: therefore will I hope in him. The Lord is good unto them that wait for him, to the soul that seeketh him. It is good that a man should both hope and quietly wait for the salvation of the Lord. For the Lord will not cast off for ever: But though he cause grief, yet will he have compassion according to the multitude of his mercies. For he doth not afflict willingly nor grieve the children of men.

Let us search and try our ways, and turn again to the Lord. Let us lift up our heart with our hands unto God in the heavens. O Lord, thou hast pleaded the causes of my soul; thou hast redeemed my life. O Lord, thou hast seen my wrong; judge thou my cause.

Thou, O Lord, remainest for ever; thy throne from generation to generation.

New National Church Council Will Combine Seven Agencies

NEW YORK, April 21—The forthcoming merger of seven international agencies into one instrument of cooperative effort—the National Council of the Churches of Christ in the USA—was cited today by Dr. Samuel McCrea Cavert, general secretary of the Federal Council of Churches, as "a response of American Christians to the challenge of the godless forces that are threatening us today." Cavert pointed out that the council will mean cooperation "as a deliberate policy" in such areas as social welfare, evangelism, religious education, education of youth in Christian living, friendship among races and peoples, and Christian missionary responsibility at home and abroad. The constituting convention will be in Cleveland November 28-December 1, the largest conclave of major Protestant and Eastern Orthodox denominations in this generation. The seven interdenominational agencies, now independent bodies, which will combine, are the Federal Council of the Churches of Christ in America; Home Missions Council of North America; International Council of Religious Education; Missionary Education Movement of the U. S. and Canada; National Protestant Council on Higher Education; United Council of Church Women and United Stewardship council. The 21 Protestant and four Eastern Orthodox churches who will comprise the National council will have 27,658,998 members are Methodist, United Lutheran, Presbyterian U. S. A., Protestant Episcopal, Northern Baptist convention, Disciples of Christ, Congregational Christian, Reformed Church in America, Presbyterian U. S., Evangelical and Reformed, United Presbyterian, Church of the Brethren, Evangelical United Brethren, National Baptist convention, Seventh Day Baptist, Moravian Friends - Five Year Meeting, Friends-Philadelphia, Roumanian Orthodox, Ukrainian Orthodox, Russian Orthodox, African Methodist Episcopal, Syrian Orthodox.
