Why is this people of Jerusalem slidden back by a perpetual backsliding? They hold fast deceit, they refuse to return. The wise men are ashamed: they have rejected the word of the Lord; and what wisdom is in them?

For every one is given to covetousness, from the prophet even unto the priest every one dealeth falsely. For they have healed the hurt of my people slightly, saying, Peace, peace; when there is no peace. I will surely consume them, saith the Lord; and the things that I have given them shall pass away from them.

The Lord our God hath put us to silence, and given us the water of gall to drink, because we have sinned against the Lord, We looked for peace, but no good came; and for a time of health, and behold trouble. For the hurt of my people I am hurt. Is there no balm in Gilead; is there no physician there? why then is not the health of my people recovered? Behold, the days come,

sait' the Lord, that I will make a new covenant with Israel. I will put my law in their inward parts, and write it in their hearts; and will be their God, and they shall be my people. And they shall teach no more every man his neighbor, and every man his brother, saying. Know the Lord: for they shall all know me, from the least of them unto the greatest of them

saith the Lord: for I will forgive their iniquity, and will remember their sin no more.

In that time, saith the Lord, the children of Israel shall come, weeping: they shall seek the Lord their God.


