For the earth shall be full of the knowledge of the Lord, as the waters cover the sea. And that root of Jesse shall stand for an ensign of the people; to it shall the Gentiles seek; and his rest shall

Strengthen ye the weak hands, and confirm the feeble knees. Say to them of fearful heart, Fear not: your God will come and save you. Then the eyes of the blind shall be opened, and the ears of the deaf shall be unstopped. Then shall the lame leap as an hart, and the tongue of the dumb sing: they shall obtain joy

and gladness, and sorrow and sighing shall flee away.

Behold, the Lord God will come with strong hand, and his arm shall rule for him: behold, his reward is with him, and his work before him. He shall feed his flock like a shepherd: he shall gather the lambs with his arm, and carry them in his bosom, and shall gently lead those that are with young.

They that wait upon the Lord shall mount up with wings as eagles; they shall run, and not be weary; and they shall walk, and not
