# President of Nicaragua, Dr. Roman, Dies

PHILADELPHIA, May 6 (AP)—The President of Nicaragua, Dr. Victor Roman Y Reyes, died at Hahnemann hospital here tonight. He was 77 years of age, and suffered from cancer. President Roman came to Hahnemann hospital—where he had served his internship a half century ago—to undergo treatment for a cancerous ulcer of the stomach. He was operated on April 3. Last rights of the Roman Catholic church were administered yesterday. Doctor Roman Y Reyes was elected president by a constituent assembly August 15, 1947. He had previously been foreign minister for a year. Earlier he had served as consul at San Francisco.
