## YM to Launch World Service Week Monday

Salem YMCA will launch its World Service week Monday night at a Y's Men's club-sponsored dinner for which George A. Fitch, a YM world service secretary just back from Korea, will speak. The local goal is \$2,125 for rebuilding of YM facilities and program over the world, according to Roy Harland, Ronald Hudkins and Douglas Chambers, chairmen.

Fitch, who will speak also to Salem Kiwanis club Tuesday noon, spent about 35 years in YM work in China, including the general secretaryship of Shanghai and Nanking associations. He served as director of the safety zone in Nanking during a Japanese siege, was decorated three times by the Chinese government and has served as Rotary club president in both Nanking and Chungking.

Following the war, Fitch was with UNRRA in China, then was sent for two years to Korea, where he helped rebuild the YM from one to 19 city associations and 20 student groups, from 200 to 150,000 members.

The Y's Men will be hosts to the board of directors, persons working in the World Service drive and their guests at the 6:30 dinner in the YM. Those going to the dinner were asked to make reservations. All persons interested were invited to hear the talk.

## Tourist Host Week Slated May 22-28

May 22 to 28 will be Tourist Host week in Oregon, as the start of an indicated record tourist year, Gov. Douglas McKay announced Saturday.

He said the state tourist bureau is getting 7,000 letters a week from prospective tourists who want to visit Oregon.

In 1949, 77,450 cars from other states rolled along the highways of Oregon, he said, bringing 2,254,000 persons.

These tourists, the governor said, spent \$110,000,000 in Oregon last year, being the state's third largest source of income.

He asked that the best possible service and accommodations be given the tourists at fair prices. The week is designated to "point up the opportunities and obligations that go with the pleasurable job of making our visitors welcome."

"Help them enjoy Oregon, so they will want to stay longer, so they will return again and again, and so they will tell their associates back home of the glories of America's most versatile vacationland," said the governor.

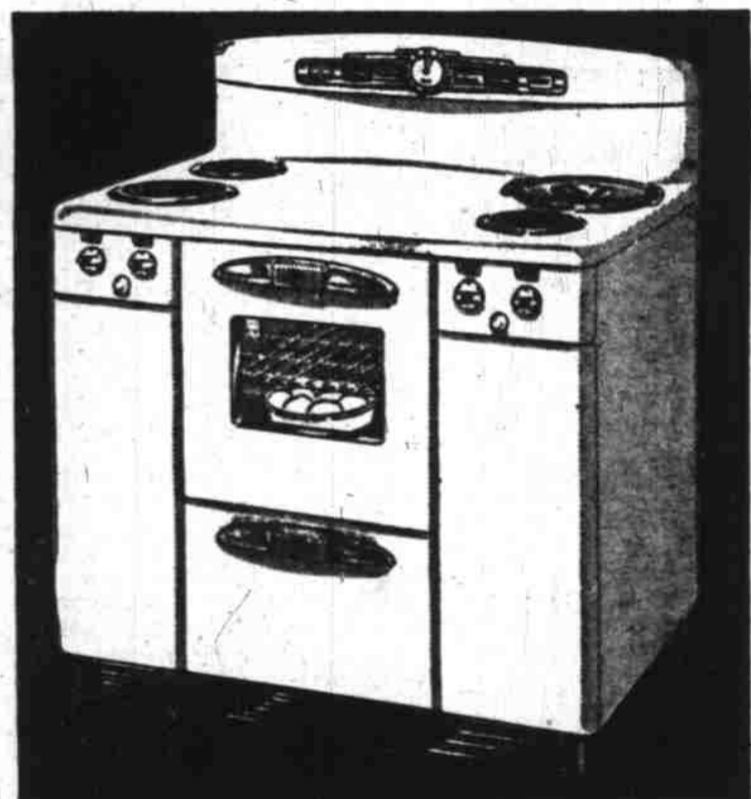
