

Rural School Budget Holds Steady Lead

The Marion county rural school budget held a 482-vote lead Tuesday night with unofficial returns in from all heavy-voting districts.

With 22 of 77 districts heard from, the tally was 1,223 yes and 741 no. The total vote reported was about 300 less than the number of ballots cast last year when voters approved the 1949 budget by a 374-vote margin.

Large favorable returns from Detroit and Stayton were reported Tuesday, but were offset by heavy voting against the budget at St. Paul (182-1) and Victor Point (180-0).

The budget had jumped into the lead when Keizer gave it a 620-vote margin in early returns.

At stake in the voting is a \$1,004,797 portion of the budget which is in excess of the 6 per cent limitation. The entire budget is \$1,197,233.

Voting boards have until Saturday to file their votes with the county school superintendent.

Fall Injuries Healed, Logger Falls to Death

WALLACE, Idaho, May 16 (AP)—Last January, Frank Bressler, a 64-year-old logger, suffered a broken shoulder in a fall. Yesterday he returned to his home after four months in a hospital. Today he was killed—in another fall.

Deputy Sheriff Lewis Gardner said Bressler fell from a mountain road near his home at Avery and struck his head on a rock. He had lived in the northern Idaho district for 20 years. There are no known survivors.

West Defense Plan Includes Civilian Chief

LONDON, May 17 (AP)—A defense concept which would place the western world's economic and military affairs under a supreme civilian chief is being advanced behind locked doors of the London Atlantic pact meeting.

Because of the United States' economic strength and its greater contribution in arms, it is expected that—if the plan is approved—the supreme chief will be an American.

A decision on the choice of such a chief and a staff of advisers was envisioned as a possible outcome of the present conference of the Atlantic pact ministers.

This chief and his staff would take charge of the economic and military buildup of the 12 Atlantic pact nations. His main job would be the bolstering of west Europe's defenses. It is understood the United States would like to see the basis of the pact broadened to include west Germany's economic power.

The defense chief, with a year around defense committee, would function in somewhat the manner supreme headquarters did during the war except, being civilian and in peace time, it probably would not have the same absolute authority.

The old concept of defense was based on the principle that western Europe would be a third balance force between the United States and the communist world. The new concept is that there can be no third force, only a single western defense against Russia. This concept links western Europe and the western hemisphere in one camp.

Convict Hunt Still Centered Near Gardiner

State police were still searching the coastal area near Gardiner Tuesday night for Richard Johnson, state prison convict who escaped Saturday, and Peter Paul Bizko, believed an accomplice in the break.

Robert Roy Hooker, Albany, told state police Monday that Johnson dashed from a prison annex strawberry patch into Bizko's waiting auto on Turner road. Bizko was released from the state prison March 13 and is believed to have helped plan Johnson's break while in the penitentiary.

Hooker, a 25-year-old laborer, was arrested by state police Monday in Toledo. He appeared in Marion county district court Tuesday and was ordered to plead today to a charge of aiding a prison convict to escape. He was being held in the county jail here on \$1,000 bail Tuesday night.

Also arrested at Toledo on the same charge was Louis Biziko, brother of the hunted Paul. Louis Biziko is being held in the Lincoln county jail at Toledo. Johnson, 29, is 5 feet, 7 inches tall, weighs 137 pounds, has brown eyes, dark brown hair and a dark complexion. Paul Biziko, 29, is 5 feet, 8 inches tall, weighs 136 pounds, has dark brown hair, blue-green eyes, light complexion and has a scar on his left forearm and left forefinger.

A tip from a Walpole cab driver who was robbed Monday night and told police that his assailants discussed the prison break prompted the search in the coastal area.

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Engineer Braves Niagara Rapids To Rescue Plane

NIAGARA FALLS, N. Y., May 16 (AP)—A 40-year-old construction engineer, hauled twice to safety, braved the Niagara rapids tonight for a third time and succeeded in his mission.

A \$25,000 helicopter wrecked yesterday in a dramatic rescue operation finally was righted and towed to shore.

Jerry Penque had two close calls earlier in attempts to pull the helicopter from the churning waters near the brink of the Horseshoe falls, on the Canadian side.

With help tonight, he got the craft to shore and it was dragged out of the river with a crane, in about three hours.

The first time he tried, his boat was swamped and he had to scramble aboard the helicopter.

The second time, several hours later, he fell into the river while reaching for the boat to grab a rope lashed to the helicopter. He pulled himself aboard the wreckage with the rope.

Husband's Kin Accused of Kidnapping

PORTLAND, May 16 (AP)—A young mother returned to her brother's home here today to accuse her husband's cousin of carrying her off for three days in Washington at gun-point.

"I don't want to see him again. Not after all this," Mrs. Virginia Wallace, 22, said in an interview here.

She said the cousin, Wayne Wallace, 31, was a family friend in Oklahoma, but on May 5 he took her 2 1/2-year-old daughter and threatened to harm the girl unless Mrs. Wallace go with him to Washington.

She said her husband, Cecil C. Wallace, is serving a five-year sentence in Leavenworth prison for being AWOL from the army.

Mrs. Wallace said she went with Wayne, but managed to slip away with her daughter at Pasco, Wash., last Wednesday, and took a bus to Portland. She went to the home of her brother, Jesse Lee Halford, east of here.

But Wayne Wallace trailed her, found her brother's home and forced her at gun-point to go away with him again Thursday night, she said.

Wallace was arrested by FBI agents at Ritzville, Wash., Saturday night. Mrs. Wallace was in a tourist cabin with him. Her brother drove there, and brought her back to Portland.

Wallace is charged with abducting the woman. He is bound over to the Portland federal court with bond set at \$5,000.

Diplomatic Mark Defended By Sprague

PORTLAND, May 16 (AP)—Former Governor Charles Sprague related some historic facts here tonight in refuting the oft repeated quip that the nation "never lost a war, but never won a conference."

He said the quip was clever, but untrue.

"Actually, we have a good diplomatic record," he said.

He noted that Ben Franklin won French support in the war of Independence; John Quincy Adams won recognition of our claims to more continental land; Charles F. Adams kept England from siding with the Confederacy and our present generation of diplomats have stemmed the tide of communism in Europe.

"We must, however, maintain a strong military establishment as long as the international tension exists—not only for strictly military reasons, but to make our diplomacy effective," he asserted.

Sprague spoke at a national defense week observance of the Sons of the American Revolution.
