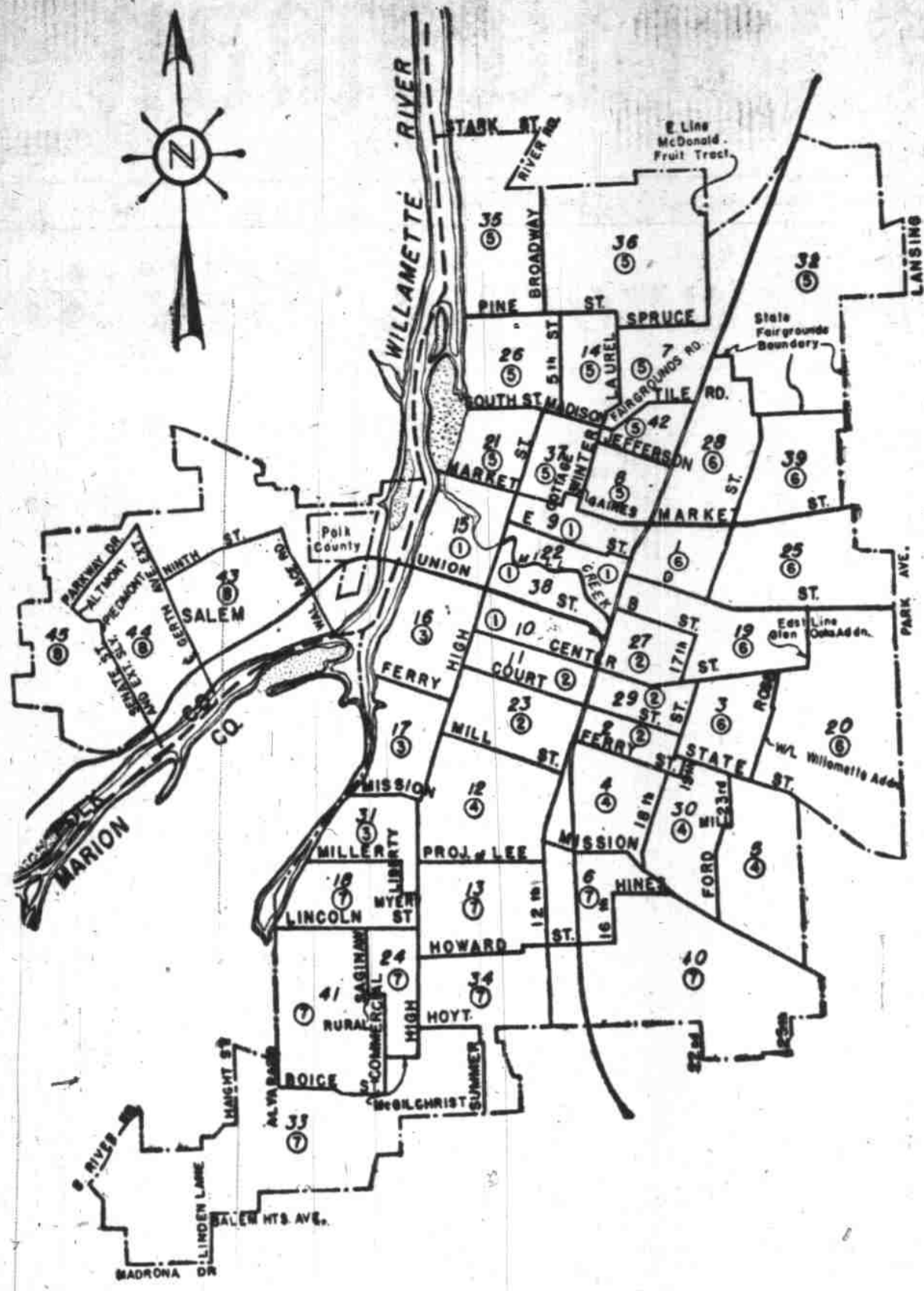

Tractor Tire Cripples Car

A California tourist was delayed in Salem several hours Thursday after his car was damaged in a collision with a tire. Ernest Vorgan, en route to Seattle from California, was driving north on highway 99E south of Salem Thursday morning when a tractor tire bounced from a pickup truck and into the hood of his car. The hood, fender and grill of Vorgan's 1949 Kaiser were heavily damaged and tow service was required to get the machine to a Salem garage. State police said the 38-inch tractor tire was being hauled on the back of a truck operated by Fred Nichols of Bend when it bounced off and down the highway into the passenger car.

Truman Lauds Steel, Coal Pool

WASHINGTON, May 18 - (AP) - President Truman today hailed the French proposal for pooling Franco-German steel and coal production as "an act of constructive statesmanship" which "opens a new outlook for Europe." The president's carefully considered formal endorsement of the plan was given in a news conference statement. Diplomats said it would give the project a powerful boost. French Foreign Minister Schuman put forward the proposal on May 9.

Cab Driver Faces Murder Charge

TOLEDO, Ore., May 18 - (AP) - Cab Driver Harry Thomas, who is still in a hospital here with a bullet wound, was indicted on a murder charge today in the death of Dale Tull Jr., Salem. Tull was fatally injured April 28 in a gunfire battle on a Newport street. Thomas, too, was badly hurt.

Demos Concede FEPC Defeat

WASHINGTON, May 18 - (AP) - Administration spokesmen today conceded defeat by at least a dozen votes tomorrow in their effort to end debate on a motion to bring a fair employment practices (FEPC) bill before the senate. The most optimistic forecast gave their side a maximum of 52 votes, or 12 less than the 64 required to choke off the southern drive against the civil rights measure, a key point in President Truman's "fair deal" program.

UNDERGROUND STRIKE ENDS
MANCHESTER, Eng., May 18 - (AP) - About 185 cold and hungry coal miners ended a staydown strike tonight at the Moston Colliery. Some had remained 1,800 feet in the pit for more than 30 hours. The staydown protested a government coal board decision to close the mine because its operation was not economical.

Reorganization Plan Defeated

WASHINGTON, May 18 - (AP) - The senate late today killed President Truman's reorganization plan for the agriculture department. The senate previously had knocked out four of the 21 reorganization proposals submitted by Mr. Truman in March. Those which escape disapproval become law after 60 days. This period ends Tuesday. A majority in either chamber can kill a plan. Earlier in the day, the house approved two of the plans to reorganize the labor and commerce departments. These two proposals are still subject to possible senate action.
