## Yamhill Tax Holds Edge; Francis Loses

McMINNVILLE, May 20.—Returns from 30 of 33 Yamhill county precincts this morning indicated that special \$1,750,000 road bond issue would be approved. Although the count for 3522 against and 3,501 for, three McMinville precincts favoring the issue had yet to report.

One upset occurred in an election which saw a near record vote cast. Carl Francis, Dayton republican incumbent for state representative from Yamhill county was edged out 2,304 to 2,257 by Elliott B. Cummings of McMinville.

## Truman Raps Congress for Delaying Draft

WASHINGTON, May 19.—(AP) President Truman said tonight there would have been no cold war if congress had voted a draft law in 1945 when he asked for it instead of waiting three years.

The president made this extemporaneous comment at a military dinner marking the observance tomorrow of Armed Forces day.

Mr. Truman's remark came as military leaders called on this nation to bulwark its defenses against a possible Russian atomic attack. These leaders declared that the "cold war" is steadily getting hotter.

Mr. Truman made a brief talk at dinner sponsored by three organizations representing veterans of the army, navy and air force.

## British Tea Ration Slashed

LONDON, May 19.—(AP)—The food ministry today cut Britain's tea ration 20 per cent. Each person will get two ounces of tea weekly instead of two and one half starting July 16.

At the same time Food Minister Maurice Webb announced the immediate abolishment of the point rationing system which has been in effect since 1942. This means such scarce foods as imported canned fish, syrups, canned and dried fruits and sweetened and chocolate biscuits (cookies) will now be ration free.

## Churchill Asks Peace Effort

EDINBURGH, Scotland, May 19.—(AP)—Winston Churchill called again tonight for a supreme effort at the highest level to end the cold war with Russia.

The 75-year-old wartime prime minister addressed the Scottish Unionist (Conservative) association. He expressed continued hope for the success of an attempt to bridge the east-west gulf.

"Great events are happening, and we must not allow the ceaseless clack and clatter which is the characteristic of our age to turn over minds from them," he said.

## Four Barges Explode at South Amboy

SOUTH AMBOY, N.J., May 19.—(AP)—Four explosive-laden barges blew up at the South Amboy docks tonight and police reported four dead, 20 to 25 missing and close to 300 injured.

Officials said dynamite and fuses hurled over a mile area and coal barges nearby caught fire. Ten carloads of munitions arrived by rail from Newark, O., the railroad said, and unloading began at noon into barges. The barges in turn were to take the munitions to a ship in the bay.

The Pennsylvania said the munitions were to be loaded on a ship of the Isbrandtsen Steamship Co. Hans J. Isbrandtsen, president of the shipping line, said in New York one of his ships was standing off South Amboy awaiting munitions bound for India. He said he did not know whether these were the munitions involved. He declined to say whether it was a private or government shipment his vessel was awaiting.

**To Evacuate Area**  
Residents were ordered to evacuate the dock area.

State highways leading to the city were congested with traffic and the city was closed off by police.

Debris from the explosion was splattered for 10 to 12 blocks, shattering automobile windshields and window panes in stores and homes. It was shopping night in South Amboy and women and children in the streets were among the injured.

The blast disrupted electric power lines and telephone service into the city. The blast shattered windows over a wide area of Staten Island, across the sound from the Jersey shore. Windows were shattered in many homes.

Luke Lyons, a railroad policeman, about 100 feet away when the blast occurred, said:

"As I looked across I saw four barges and after the blast I looked and couldn't see any."

Badly Cut in Blast  
Lyons was badly cut in the explosion.

Other eye witnesses said the nearby American Agricultural Chemical Co. plant was practically destroyed.

Arthur Humphrey of Kearney, working in the plant, said "All of a sudden the blast knocked everyone off their feet."

## Queen Mother Of Egypt Risks Title for Pair

SAN FRANCISCO, May 19.—(AP)—The queen mother of Egypt strongly hinted tonight she would sacrifice her title and all royal prerogatives if need be to assure the marriage of her princess daughter to a commoner.

She tucked it into a new softy-worded statement she fired at Prince Mohamed Ali, heir apparent to the Egyptian throne. It was the latest development in the growing furore over the romance.

Prince Mohamed, 74-year-old head of the crown council, has joined with King Farouk in efforts to prevent a Moslem ceremony uniting 19-year-old Princess Fathia, sister of the king, and Riad Ghali, 31, a Christian commoner.

Last night the prince, replying in Cairo to the charge of political intrigue, called the behavior of Queen Nazli "incompatible with her situation of wife and mother of kings of a Moslem nation."

"Tonight the queen mother issued this statement:

"I sincerely forgive Prince Mohamed Ali his statement. How can he understand in the middle of his childhood grandeur that a queen can sacrifice even her crown if only to spare her child a heart-felt misery?"

## Cons Escape At Walla Walla

WALLA WALLA, Wash., May 19.—(AP)—Three men scaled the walls of the Washington state prison here tonight in one of the most dramatic escape attempts in recent years.

Two were apprehended by prison guards within a short time but the third is still at large. He is Felix Kolakowski, 31, serving a term from King county for armed robbery.

Cordeon John Cranor said the men escaped from the athletic yard when they tore a plank off the boxing ring, leaned it against the wall and climbed over. Guards saw the men as they went over the top and opened fire, but the men were soon out of range.
