Rock Religious Statue Back After 9 Days

SAN JOSE, Costa Rica, May 21—(AP)—Devout Catholics rejoiced today for the recovered Virgin of Los Angeles, a black rock statue revered as the patroness of Costa Rica, which disappeared nine days ago and mysteriously reappeared yesterday.

Church bells rang out the news of the reappearance and the faithful thronged the streets in celebration. Archbishop Victor Manuel Sanabria and other church and government officials hurried to Cartago, 20 miles southeast of San Jose to view the image, valued at \$150,000.

At midnight last night a solemn mass was celebrated at the basilica. A dawn hundreds of pilgrims streamed to Cartago. Churches throughout the nation were jammed with worshippers giving thanks for the return of the virgin.

State Board of Health Backs Federal Grants

THE DALLES, Ore., May 21—(AP)—The Oregon State Board of Health approved federal hospital construction grants of \$238,000 here yesterday. The program calls for two buildings valued at \$714,000 with \$2 of local funds for each \$1 federal allocation. The board action okayed \$178,000 for the Portland Sanitarium and \$60,000 to the Physicians and Surgeons hospital, Portland.

Northwest May Get Mississippi Flood Funds

WASHINGTON, May 21—(AP)—Funds now allocated to the Mississippi valley may be shifted to the northwest, if anticipated floods come, Senator Dworshak (R-Idaho) said today.

Approval of the appropriations committee would be necessary and Dworshak said he talked with Chairman McKellar (D-Tenn) of the senate appropriations committee yesterday about the northwest threat. Dworshak formerly a member of the committee.

Thursday, Dworshak, Senator Taylor and Rep. White obtained promises of aid from the forest service and Indian bureau.

Dworshak said the army engineer, at his request, have directed Col. O. E. Walsh to take any steps which might minimize damage.

Professors Ask Lattimore's Case Settled

BALTIMORE, May 21—(AP)—A group of Johns Hopkins university professors today called on the senate subcommittee investigating charges against Owen Lattimore to "make a definite pronouncement... on the truth or falsity" of the charges.

The action was urged in a resolution unanimously adopted by the Johns Hopkins chapter of the American Association of University Professors.

It sent a copy of the resolution to Senator Tydings (D-Md.), chairman of the foreign relations subcommittee.

Last Tuesday Lattimore's colleagues sponsored a dinner and reception in his honor as a testimony to their faith in his loyalty to this country.

The director of the Walter Hines Page school of international relations at Hopkins and a noted authority on far eastern politics, Lattimore has been the key figure in the subcommittee's probe. The investigation was launched after Senator McCarthy (R-Wis) charged that the state department had been overrun and influenced by communists.

3 Taken from Candidates List At University

EUGENE, May 21—(AP)—Three candidates for student body offices in the University of Oregon were stricken from the list today as an outgrowth of a demonstration in the campus campaigns.

Hob Deuel, president of the Associated Greek students, said the students were members of the A.G.S. and the action was taken in the interest of good student government. He named them as Gerald Smith, Will Urban and Dick McLaughlin.

"All these candidates have been subject to charges and counter-charges regarding membership in the Theta Nu Epsilon," he added. The named fraternity is a national secret society barred from the Oregon campus because of its record of campus disturbances relative to student political affairs.

Oklahoma City Wife Confesses Kidnap Hoax

OKLAHOMA CITY, May 22—(AP)—Chief of Detectives Dwight Brown said Mrs. Jo Alice Raper, 23, pretty wife of a police vice squad officer, tearfully admitted early today that a kidnapping story she had related earlier was a figment of her imagination.

Brown said Mrs. Raper told officers she was not abducted from her home. He quoted her as saying she had called her husband several times during her absence to frighten him, adding she stayed away 21 hours on her own accord.

Brown said she could give no plausible reason for her action. Earlier she said two men kidnapped her from her bedroom Sunday morning, released her late last night unharmed.

The telephone her husband, Officer C. V. Raper, from a suburban filling station. He and two fellow detectives picked her up there and brought her home in a car.

Officer Raper told reporters his wife "was in a dazed condition but unharmed."

In her earlier story Mrs. Raper said she was not nude when she was kidnapped by the abductors. She explained she slipped on a seersucker suit and accompanied the two men after they broke into her bedroom and threatened her.

Age of Captors

She had said her abductors were about 40 and 20 years old.

The kidnap victim told reporters she was held captive in a room somewhere in Oklahoma City all day with a woman standing guard.

Hard Wife Scream

Lt. Wayne Harbort of the police homicide force said Raper got a telephone call Sunday afternoon and heard his wife screaming.

The caller hung up before the call could be traced.

Officer Raper told fellow policemen he had received several threatening telephone calls last week. They were followed by a note which said in part:

"Get this straight and stay out of my business or that woman will have to take your punishment."

The officer is assigned to the police gambling detail.

Wood Alcohol Drink Fatal to Two Soldiers

ANCHORAGE, Alaska, May 21—(AP)—Two soldiers were dead today, two were in critical condition and nine others were hospitalized after drinking methanol (wood) alcohol taken from the Fort Richardson motor pool.

Military officials said the 13 servicemen held an "experimental" drinking party Friday night. One of the men died last night and the second early today.

All were members of the 813th Engineer battalion at the fort. Names were withheld pending notification of next of kin.

The alcohol is used at the motor pool as a cold weather starting fluid. Hospital attendants said it is a dangerous poison and can cause blindness, coma and death. Its full effects are usually delayed 24 to 48 hours.

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Independence Trio Improving

Three members of an Independence family who were hospitalized in Salem Saturday after an auto crash near Independence were reported "showing improvement" Sunday night at Salem Memorial hospital.

Confined at the hospital are Kenneth Gearhard, his wife, Lilla, and their 11-year-old daughter, Florence Scharum. None was reported in serious condition.

Sunbathing Girl Killed by Runaway Car

EUGENE, May 21—(AP)—Barbara Jean Paul, 9, died in Sacred Heart hospital here today of injuries suffered when hit by a runaway car while sun-bathing in her yard.

The automobile also ran over and injured her sister, Jeannette Yvonne, 11, who was lying with Barbara on a blanket yesterday at their Glenwood home.

The driver of the car was a 15-year-old boy. He is being held on a charge of reckless driving.

Officers said the boy lost control of the car and it careened onto the lawn after bowling over a row of mail boxes and hurtling across the street.

Hospital attendants said today that the older girl was in fair condition. The girls are the daughters of Mrs. Harold M. Jeffries.

Anti-Aircraft Rocket Fires 12 Miles High

NEW YORK, May 21—(AP)—Gen. J. Lawton Collins, army chief of staff, said today the army has a new anti-aircraft rocket which will fire 12 miles in the air.

The rocket, called the "Loki," will be "capable of destroying attacking planes," Gen. Collins said in a radio interview transcribed for the CBS "People's Platform" program.

Gen. Collins said the new weapon still was in the testing stage. He pointed out that Loki was the God of Norse mythology who was supposed to release the hosts of Hades and added:

"That's exactly what we intend to do if anyone ever attacks the United States."

He did not reveal further details of the new weapon.

Commie Claims Berlin March Plans Diluted

BERLIN, May 21—(AP)—A communist free German youth official who described himself as a deserter, said today iron measures of the west have scared off many from the proposed march on Berlin next week end.

He said only about 250,000—not the 500,000 the leaders have boasted would participate in the Whitesundt rally—will show up. Many east zone parents—disturbed by western counter-propaganda—won't let their children attend, he added, and only about 6,000 young propagandists actually have been assigned to the task of filtering in to west Berlin.

The anti-communist newspaper, Telegraf, gave full credence to his story though the possibility remained his account was intended to plant a false feeling of security among westerners. The official, who said he was a member of the central committee of communist youth, was not named.

According to the fugitive, most of the demonstrators will be under strict discipline to keep them on their own side of the east sector boundary.

Most of those assigned to infiltrate into the western sectors "will stand on the Soviet-allied boundary, cheer passing columns, sing songs and seek to join the marchers as pseudo-west Berliners," he asserted.

Some will attempt to make speeches urging west Berliners to support the rally.

The chief action on the boundary is planned to last 20 minutes. The main points are Brandenburg gate and Potsdamer platz," he said.

K. of C. Elects State Officers

Yugoslavia, Greece Talk on Friendly Terms

BELGRADE, May 21—(AP)—Yugoslavia and Greece—unfriendly neighbors for many months—established today a more amiable relationship which may ease the tension in the Balkans.

It came through a formal exchange of diplomats. Yugoslavia picked Serif Sehic to represent this nation at Athens. Greece appointed Demetris Pappas as minister to Belgrade.

Both are career diplomats of long experience. They will have to draw upon all of their experience in overcoming many problems which have arisen in the three years of dissension between their two countries.

The action reflected in particular Yugoslavia's resentment against the Kremlin-led communist anti-Tito activities. It stemmed directly from Yugoslavia's charge that it was sold out by the Russians in the Greek civil war in an effort to "get" Premier Marshal Tito.

(Yugoslavia, along with Albania and Bulgaria, were accused by the United Nations investigators of supplying, training and helping the communist guerrillas in the Greek war, which ended last October.)

Princess Faika To Obey Order To Visit Egypt

SAN FRANCISCO, May 21—(AP)—Egyptian King Farouk's directive to his mother and sisters here bore their first apparent fruit today.

Princess Faika—One of the monarch's sisters now residing in San Francisco—said today she and her new husband, Dr. Fouad Sadek, will obey Farouk's order to return to Cairo.

When? She said only "soon—maybe tomorrow, maybe Tuesday, it may be Wednesday, but it will be soon."

However, there were no indications that pretty 19-year-old Fathia, the sister-princess whose marriage to commander Riad Ghalil angered the king, is entertaining notions of embarking for home.

Both Fathia and Faika, whose husband also is a commander, the Queen Mother Nazli and Ghalil were commanded last week to return to Egypt. Apparent cause of the order was Farouk's anger over Fathia's announced intention of sealing her civil marriage to Ghalil at a Moslem wedding ceremony.

But for the moment, the wedding preparations have been suspended because of the illness of the queen mother.

Ghalil said, however, that the rites will be held as soon as the queen mother is on her feet and that they probably will be in the Fairmont hotel where the queen has lived for more than two years.

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
