Willamette Graduation Lists Announced; Rites Set June 11

Names of about 225 students who will be granted degrees by Willamette university at commencement on June 11 were announced Wednesday by President G. Herbert Smith, following faculty approval. The June class includes 182 persons.

Commencement will be at 8 p.m. in the university gymnasium. Kenneth McCormick, Willamette graduate in 1928 and editor-in-chief of Doubleday Publishing company of New York, is to be commencement speaker.

Baccalaureate services are scheduled for this Sunday at 3 o'clock at First Methodist church with Dr. Daniel Poling of Philadelphia delivering the sermon. Alumni day will be June 10 on the campus.

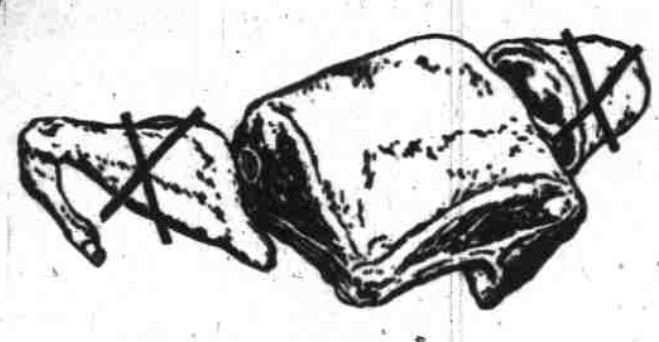

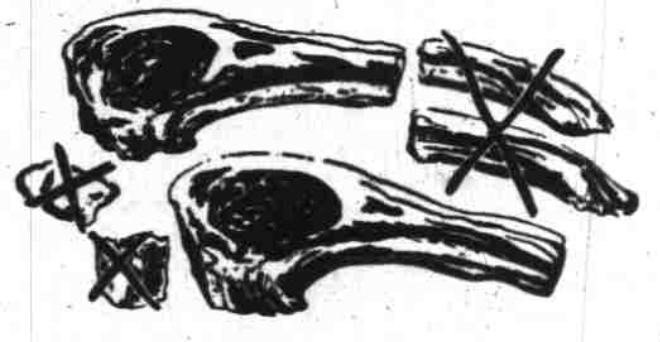

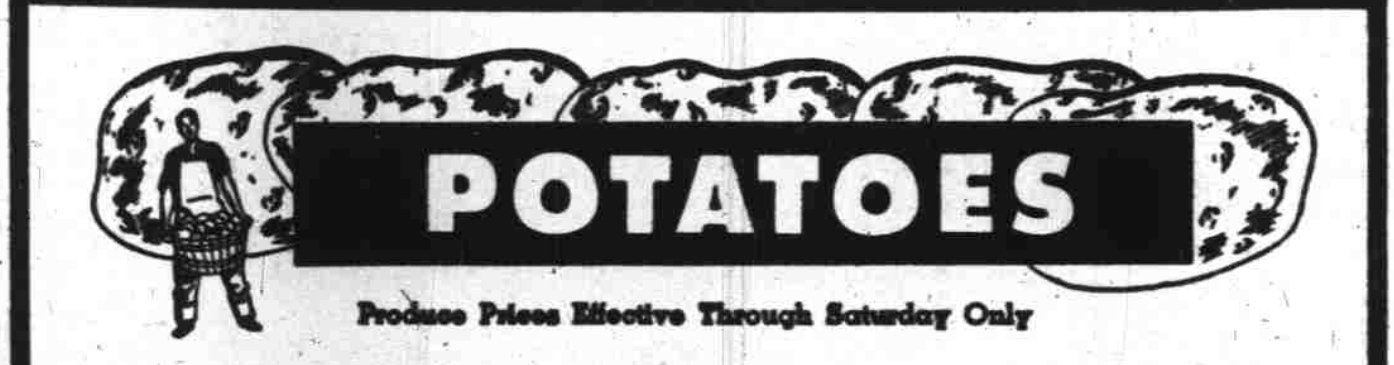
