Scholarships Available to Navy Reserves

Availability of scholarships to the U.S. naval academy for members of the naval and marine reserves was announced in Salem Wednesday by Comdr. D. N. Morey, Jr., inspector-instructor for the navy reserve here.

The scholarships, for four years' college and military training ending in a navy or marine commission, are given each year to 160 reservists.

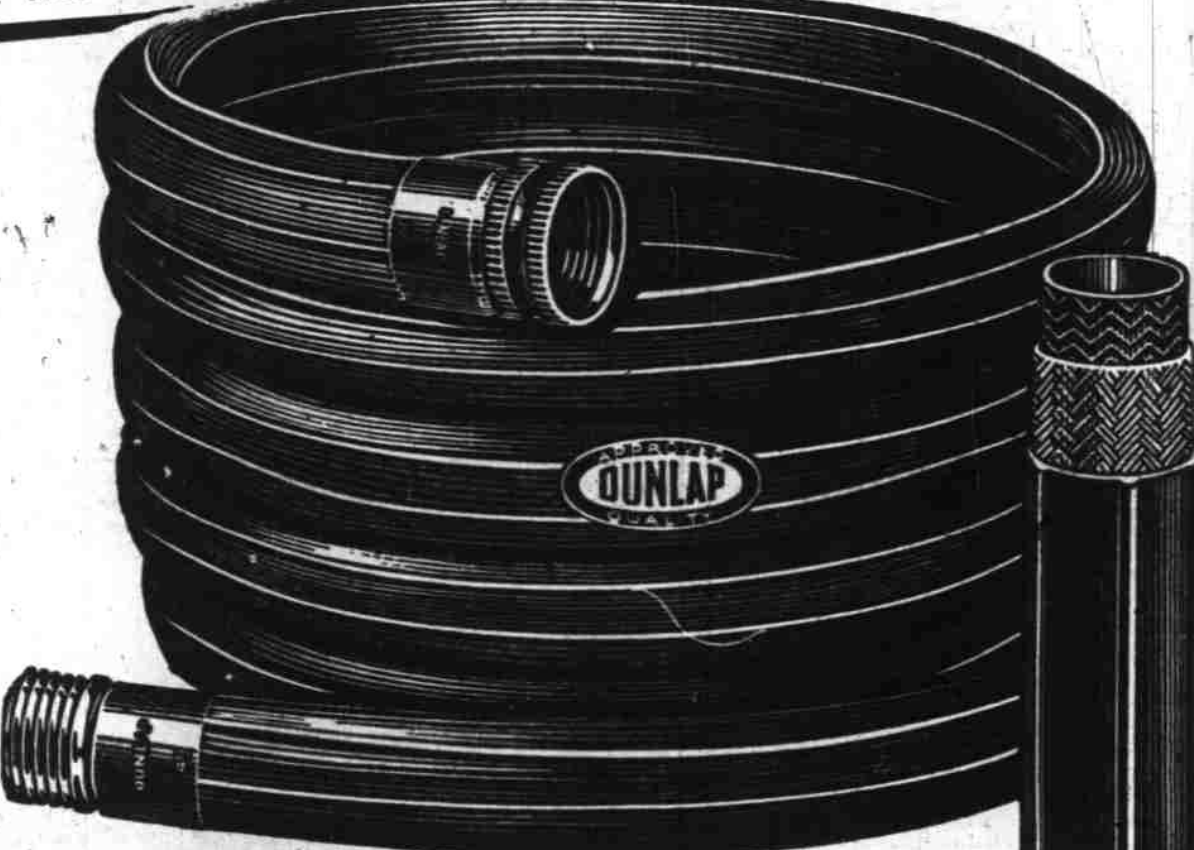
Those who wish to take the examinations next April 18 for academy entrance in the fall of 1951 must be in the reserve by this June 30. They must meet physical requirements, be unmarried, high school graduates and not over 21 years of age at examination time. The age limit can be raised to 23 years for those with one year of active duty.

Information is available at the Salem naval and marine reserve training center. Several youths already have indicated plans to apply.

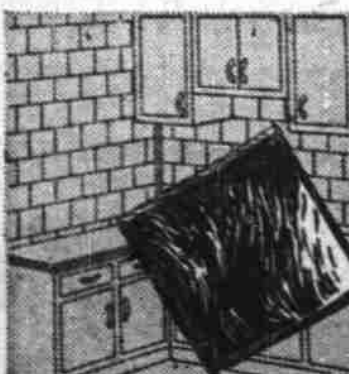

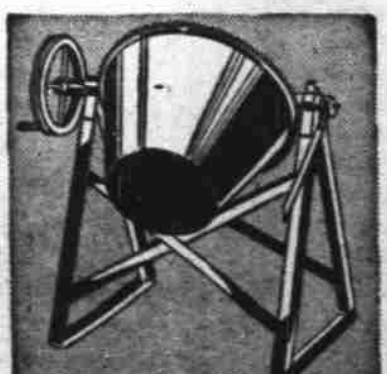
