The most serious damage occurred at the J. G. Cronin residence on East Nursery street where the roof caught fire while the family was entertaining dinner guests.

Nearly the entire roof was aflame before the blaze was noticed. Neighbors carried household goods to safety while firemen extinguished the blaze. The damage was covered by insurance. Personal property in the attic was destroyed.

Fire Captain Harold Shields suffered minor face burns and was treated by a McMinnville physician. The Cronin's will live temporarily with the Bernard Kosta family who were dinner guests when the fire broke out.

Another roof fire, resulting in only minor damage, occurred the same day at the John Stowik farm home. The family had the fire under control when the fire department arrived.
