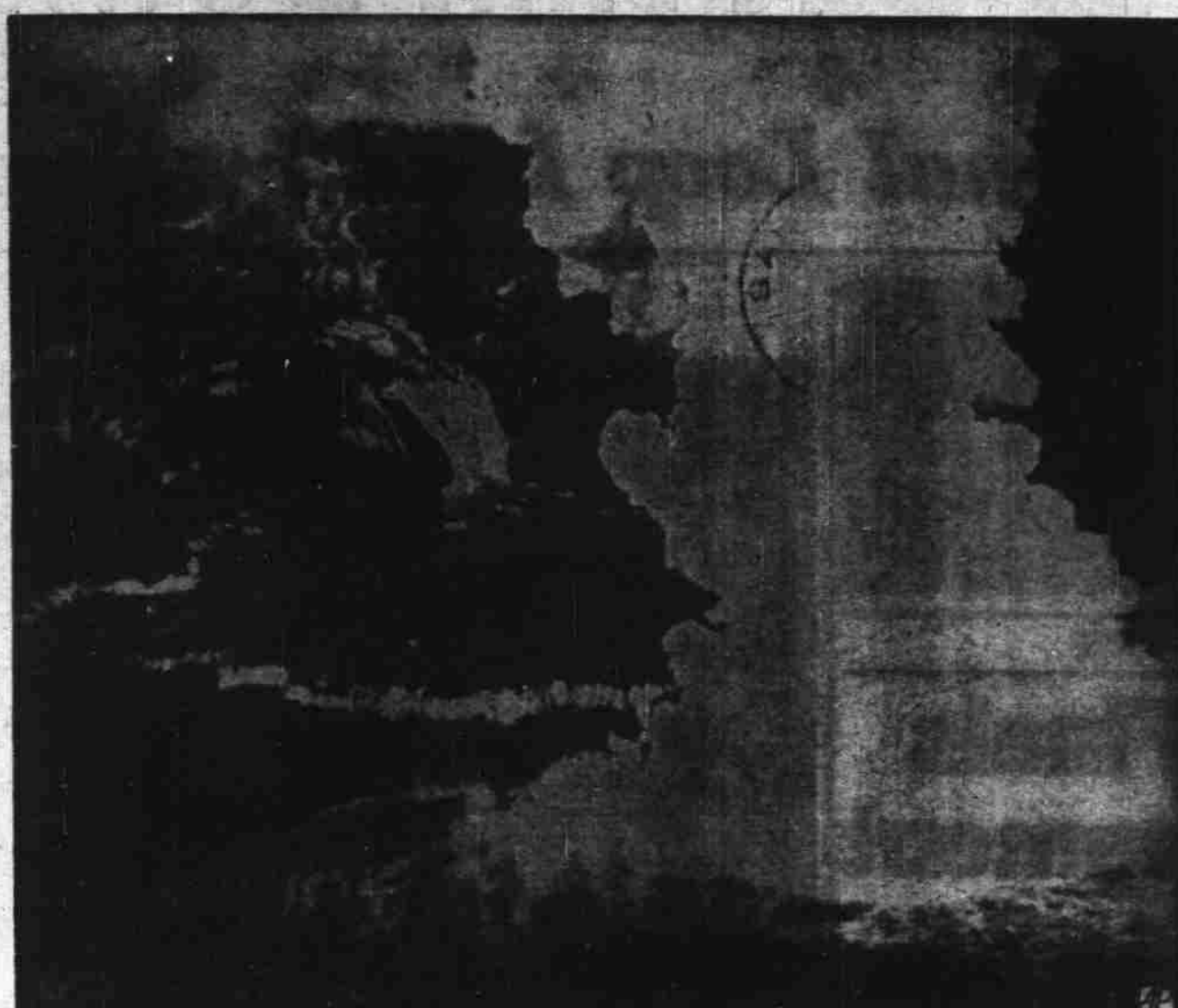

Nation Watches Roosevelt vs. Warren Fight

SAN FRANCISCO, June 4—(P)—National interest will ride with the ballots in California's primary election Tuesday.

Gov. Earl Warren, a progressive republican, is bidding for a third term on his record. He faces the name-lure of a Roosevelt-lanky James Roosevelt—and a promised democratic new deal for his adopted state.

"Failure... Failure... Failure," Roosevelt has cried as he pounded at the Warren administration. He accused the governor, 1948 republican candidate for vice president, of inaction on unemployment, cleaning up organized crime, building highways and schools.

"Prophet of doom..." "Political opportunist," Warren flung back at the late FDR's eldest son. California leads the nation in every governmental field, he said. And it was all accomplished with balanced budgets and pay-as-you-go spending.

Cross Filing
Both Warren and Roosevelt are running on opposition party tickets, as permitted under the state's direct primary rules. Victory on both tickets would mean election. But should a candidate lose the nomination on his own party tickets he'd be ineligible for the final election contest, even though he might have won on the opposition primary ballot.

Democratic leaders, looking at their party's hefty 1,000,000 advantage in the voter registration, hope to crack the republican 12-11 majority in the state's 23-man congressional delegation.

Truman Carried State
California has registered democratic since 1932. It voted four

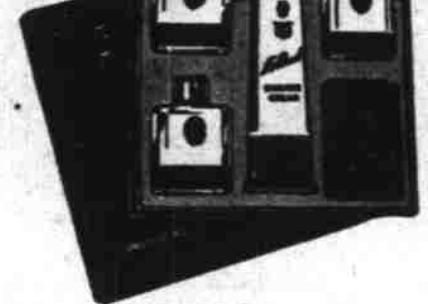

times for FDR. President Truman carried the state two years ago—even with Warren on the republican ticket.

But in between, the voters elected and reelected a republican governor; retained its solid slate of other GOP state officers, and returned republican legislatures.

Most candidates crossed this year. California's direct primary law allows office-seekers to enter as many party races as they like. If you win both republican and democratic nominations, you're elected at the primary.

Big Earl Warren did it four years ago. A Warren presidential boom started straight off. If he can do it again, and beat a Roosevelt at that, you'll hear "Warren for President in '52." If Roosevelt can unseat the state's champion vote-getter, he will jump into the national picture.
