### Production of American Cheese In Oregon Doubled Over March

The production of American cheese in Oregon is stepping up rapidly and the production of butter has been declining, according to the weekly market review prepared by the United States Department of Agriculture.

Figures just completed show that the April production was 2.6 million pounds of cheese. This is nearly double the March output and also the highest April production since 1947. The increase from the fifth highest on record for the 15 years. The April production was March to April is the second largest for this period during the past month in Oregon.

Oregon continues the largest cheese producer of the three west coast states. The output of American cheese in California and Washington is relatively small. The production of cheese in Idaho has been holding a high rate for that state since the first of the year and has been running ahead of Oregon during the early spring. Indications are, however, for the late spring and summer months Oregon's cheese production will be above that in Idaho.

While Oregon heads the coast on cheese production, it is the smallest butter producer on the coast. Idaho also produces more butter than does Oregon. California is the largest producer of the three coast states and Washington the second.

Cheese plants in Oregon continue to pay producers the highest price for milk sold for manufacturing purposes. During the spring, the USDA reports, the cheese plants have been running about 12 cents higher a pound for butterfat than have the butter manufacturing plants. Milk used in the bottle and can trade in Oregon averaged 54 cents higher per pound butterfat in April than did milk going into cheese. However, compared to a year ago prices paid producers for whole-milk used in the bottle and can trade have dropped the most. The average April return this year to Oregon producers was 13 cents a pound butterfat under April last year. Cheese and butter plants are both paying 3 cents a pound less.

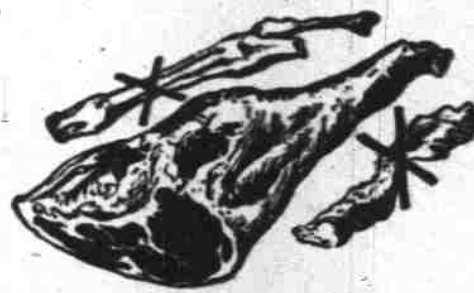
