

Forrestal Diary Requested in Amerasia Case

WASHINGTON, June 9—(AP)—Republican Senator Knowland demanded in the senate today that the White house open up the long-sealed Forrestal diary for possible light on one of the most puzzling aspects of the 1945 Amerasia secret documents case.

Knowland said the diary may answer this question:

Who issued a go-slow order to stall off arrests in the Amerasia case—and why?

The diary has been locked up in the White house since ever since James V. Forrestal, the nation's first secretary of defense, plunged to his death from the 16th story of the U.S. naval medical center at Bethesda, Md., on May 22, 1949.

President Truman has cold-shouldered earlier requests from congress for a look at the Forrestal diary, presumably on the ground that it contains references to many top secrets.

Pioneer Amity Woman Dies At Monmouth

MONMOUTH, June 9—Mrs. Matilda Garrison Jones, who was born in a log cabin at Amity 95 years ago, died Friday at her home in Monmouth. She had been ill for six months.

Mrs. Jones was the daughter of a circuit-riding Methodist preacher who came to Oregon by ox team in 1846. The family moved to Salem in 1869, and Mrs. Jones attended the old school at South Commercial and Bush streets, then Salem academy.

Services will be Sunday at 2:30 p.m. at the Smith mortuary in Independence. Interment will be at the Amity cemetery.

Truman Says Foreign Aid To Continue

COLUMBIA, Mo., June 9—(AP)—President Truman, speaking before a rain-soaked crowd of fellow Missourians pledged his country today to carry on its aid to other free nations until they are safe from Russian "internal subversion or external attack."

From a yellow canopy-covered stand in a football field, he voiced a warning to communist imperialism that "our vital national interest in a healthy world economy" will not end when Marshall plan aid ends in 1952.

The solemn, gray-haired Missourian, who couldn't find time to finish his law course at the University of Kansas City night school, spoke before receiving an honorary doctor of laws degree one of many that has come his way as president.

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Newfoundland Fire Nears City

ST. JOHN'S, Nfld., June 9—(AP)—A blazing forest fire crept to within 2½ miles of Lewisport, Nfld., tonight before a dying wind lessened danger to the northern port.

Lewisport residents were prepared to flee if necessary. Stored in the town are some 2,000,000 gallons of high octane gasoline for the huge airbase at Gander.

The wind, as it calmed down, changed in direction from westerly to northwesterly. This also reduced the danger.

350,000 Votes Polled by Red In California

SAN FRANCISCO, June 9—(AP)—A woman who ran for office as a registered communist received more than 350,000 votes in the California primary Tuesday.

The candidate, Bernadette Doyle of San Diego, was easily outdistanced by incumbent Roy E. Simpson in the non-partisan race for state superintendent of public instruction.

Simpson polled 896,830 votes in 10,800 of the 18,022 precincts counted. His communist opponent received 362,342.

Methodists Vote to Outlaw Fringe Group

TACOMA, June 9—(AP)—A resolution to outlaw a "fringe group" of Methodism was passed today by the Pacific northwest conference of the Methodist church.

The group referred to is an organization known as "The Methodist Federation for Social Action," and the resolution said in part:

"To affirm that there is no need or place in the economy of the Methodist church for any unauthorized organization, however sincere its members may be, which uses our church, its name, its facilities, its congregations, its property and its prestige as instruments of independent propaganda."

"To take such steps as may be necessary to make clear, without implying either approval or condemnation of any specific positions of the group, that it does not recognize the group which calls itself 'The Methodist Federation for Social Action' as its interpreter of moral, social, economic or political issues."

In a resolution passed yesterday the conference voted to ask the United States and other nations to outlaw the use of the A and H bombs.

Cherry Tree Spray Order Issued by State

Willamette valley cherry growers should start their spray or dust programs at once and maintain a protective spray or dust cover on their trees until harvest.

The official spray or dust notices for the cherry fruit fly control were sent out Friday by S. C. Jones, associate entomologist at Oregon State college.

Either a lead arsenate, rotenone, or methoxychlor-roteneone spray or dust program is recommended for cherry fruit fly control, D. L. Rasmussen, Marion extension agent, states. Lead arsenate is recommended for processing cherries and a rotenone or methoxychlor-roteneone program on cherries for fresh market use.

Control area order No. 13 of the Oregon department of agriculture will be in effect in Marion, Polk and Linn counties again this year. This order protects the cherry industry in these counties by a compulsory spray or dust program.

Drivers Cited After Wreck

Two Salem area drivers were cited to appear in court on traffic violation charges after their auto collided about 7:30 p.m. Friday near Salem on the highway to Dallas.

State police said Jacob Janzen, 779 Gerth ave., was driving a car that crashed into the right side of a car which was turning right off the highway. The second car was driven, officers said by John Wesley Hopkins, Salem route 8.

Police said the right side of the Janzen car and the front end of the Hopkins auto both were damaged "rather extensively" but neither driver was injured.

Alaska Firms Face Justice Bureau Suits

WASHINGTON, June 9—(AP)—The justice department today moved in on Alaskan business with the biggest batch of anti-trust prosecutions ever undertaken at one time in a single area.

Based on 10 sealed indictments returned last Monday by a federal grand jury at Anchorage, the actions were directed against a half dozen lines of trade, including shipping, fuel supplies, food, the liquor business, taxicabs and dry cleaning services. The indictments named 23 corporations, 138 individuals and two liquor dealer associations.

Attorney General McGrath said more actions are to come.

His announcement disclosed that for nearly a year the justice department has been investigating what it described as "collusive arrangements among business groups which have obstructed the development and expansion of the Alaskan economy."

Grand Ronde Man Injured In Car Wreck

A Grand Ronde man incurred head injuries Friday night when his auto sideswiped a parked wrecker, skidded about 300 feet and crashed into some timber along the coast highway about eight miles northwest of Dallas.

Jerry Collins, 22, was taken by the Dallas city ambulance to McMinville general hospital where attendants said his condition was not serious late Friday night.

State police said the wrecker was parked along the road while its driver, David H. Moser, Dallas, was preparing to tow away another auto which had crashed off the highway into a ditch earlier in the day. There was no injuries reported from the first accident.

The accident occurred about 7 p.m. on Butler hill. Police said the Collins car was not damaged beyond repair.

MOSCOW, June 9—(AP)—Prime Minister Urho Kekkonen of Finland was ceremoniously welcomed to Moscow today for the signing of a new Finnish-Soviet trade pact.

2 Hollywood Writers Begin Prison Terms

WASHINGTON, June 9—(AP)—Two Hollywood writers went handcuffed together to jail today to begin one-year sentences for refusing to tell congress whether they were ever communists.

The two, John Howard Lawson and Dalton Trumbo, were among ten screen figures who defied the house unAmerican activities committee. The others go to trial this month.

The jailed pair, convicted of contempt of congress and given the heaviest sentences the court could impose, also must pay \$1,000 fines.

However, there remained a chance of their winning a reduction of sentences.

Hot Weather Keeps Eastern U.S. Sweating

Hot, humid weather kept residents of much of the eastern United States sweating Friday.

A tornado killed one person and injured four others at McPherson, Kan. Lightning set two buildings afire in Abilene, Kan.

Heat and humidity brought distress to millions. Few cities reported temperatures over 90 but the high moisture content of the air made it seem hotter. Scattered thundershowers brought little relief.

The warm and humid area lay mostly east of the Mississippi river and south of Iowa. Temperatures generally were in the upper 80's. The forecaster said tomorrow will bring another day of it, except in Minnesota, Wisconsin, northern Michigan and northern Illinois. It'll be cooler in those sections.

Woman Dies Just Prior to 95th Birthday

SILVERTON, June 9—Mrs. Olive Jane Gorrett Moser, a native of Oregon, died here today. She would have been 95 next Wednesday.

Mrs. Moser was born at Marquam, where she was married to Joseph Henry Moser June 9, 1870.

Surviving are four of six children born to them, Gilbert Moser, Salem, Frank and Lloyd Moser, both of Silverton, and Mary Della Young, Oregon City.

Services will be announced later by Ekman's mortuary.
