

Campaign Day Action Set for Girls' State

Today is convention and campaign day for nearly 200 Oregon girls visiting Salem for the annual Girls' State program sponsored by American Legion auxiliary. The girls are divided into two camps, the nationalist and the federalist parties, which will conduct separate nominating conventions on the Willamette university campus this morning. Later in the day a general campaign for votes will be waged by the girls whose program is designed to instruct in government and good citizenship.

But all is not politics and instruction for the girls. Tonight at 8:15 they will take time off to stage a style show at Baxter hall. They will model clothes they have made for themselves.

During the all-week program, the delegates will form a model state legislature and administration after electing girls to fill all the Oregon elective posts.

In Tuesday sessions the girls received general instruction in government from their counselors and heard talks by Capt. William Brown of the Portland police department and by Thomas L. McCall, secretary to Gov. Douglas McKay. McCall explained the probable growing state deficit as Oregon's No. 1 problem at present.

Another outside speaker Tuesday was Salem City Manager J. L. Franzen who discussed city government. The girl delegates are organizing model city and county administrations as well as a state legislature.

It was announced that Esther Perkins of Salem will edit the year's Girls' State paper, assisted by Sarah Archibald of Grants Pass, who last year was one of two girl delegates chosen to go to the nation's capitol for Girls' Nation.

Among other adult leads in the program are Mrs. Frank Zinn, Mrs. M. Pearce, Salem, in charge of Baxter hall; Mrs. Allan Rymat, Bend, nurse; Mrs. Craig Coyner, Bend, dining room; Mrs. Austin H. Wilson, Salem, publicity.

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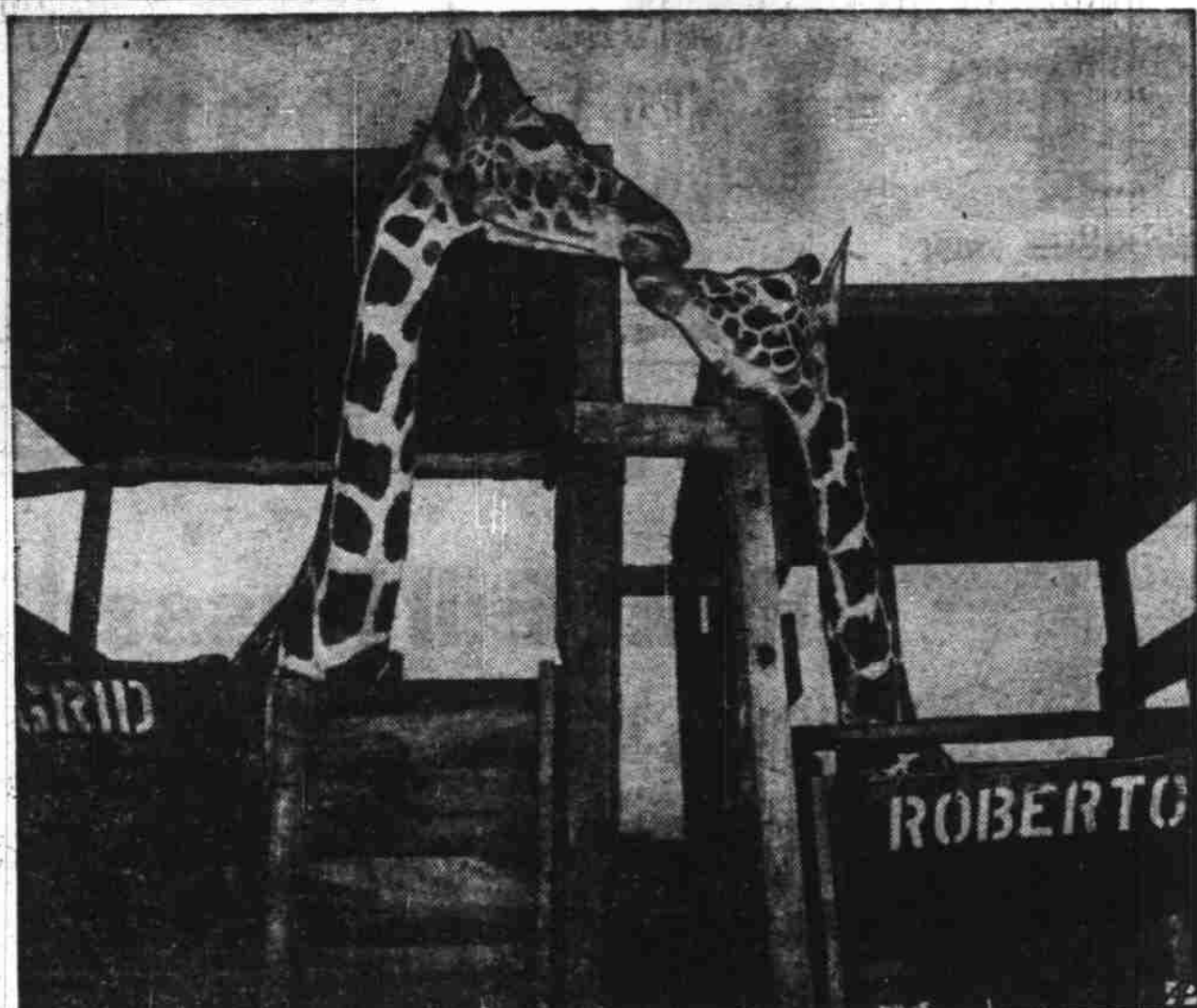

More Arrests In Drive on Young Gangs

A former Salem resident, 20-year-old Joseph Robert Vicenzi, jr., was arrested in Eugene Tuesday by a Marion county sheriff's deputy as officers continued investigation of local teen-aged burglary gangs.

Vicenzi, charged with burglary not in a dwelling, admitted theft of some jewelry from a local store, officers said. He is also being questioned in connection with Salem area house break-ins that have jailed several local youths.

Vicenzi, who moved to Eugene recently, was being held Tuesday night in the county jail on \$1,500 bail and will appear this morning in district court.

In other action Tuesday, Glenn Edward Trumbley, 19, of 840 S. 25th st., pleaded guilty in circuit court to a charge of burglary not in a dwelling. Trumbley, an admitted participant in recent larges of about 40 cases of beer by seven Salem youths, appeared before Judge George R. Duncan and was continued for pre-sentence investigation.

Three juveniles, a 15-year-old and a 16-year-old who were members of the same beer-stealing gang and a 16-year-old who admitted stealing tires, were released from the county jail Tuesday, pending court action. None of the trio has a previous record at the sheriff's office.

Meanwhile, new burglaries, some of which appeared to be the work of juveniles, were being investigated Tuesday by city, county and state police officers.

City police were probing a break-in at the Doolittle Oil distributing company on Wallace road in west Salem and a burglary at the Beutler-Quistad Lumber company, 495 Wallace rd. Officers were ransacked but apparently nothing was missing from either establishment.

State and county officers, however, reported three burglaries in the county that netted cash, cigarettes and a gun. A .32 automatic pistol, about \$18 and some oil supplies were stolen from the Union Oil service station at Cherry avenue and North River road, and about \$5 in cash was reported missing from the Coomler and Franz grocery next to the gas station.

In addition, about \$75 and several cartons of cigarettes were taken from the Greyhound bus depot at Jefferson.

Trio Beats Breakers After Boat Capsizes

NEWPORT, Ore., June 13—(AP)—A swift tide swept three young persons to sea today, where waves capsized their rowboat, but all battled through the breakers to shore.
