

Visiting Lectures to Feature Willamette Summer Sessions

Visiting lecturers in economics and international relations will feature the annual Willamette university summer session, starting Monday, Dr. George Martin, director, announced Wednesday. About 200 students are expected to take work from a faculty of 18 instructors. Registration will be Monday, and the eight weeks of classes will begin Tuesday, closing August 11.

Returning as a visitor this year will be Dr. Bohus A. Benes, former Pacific coast consul for Czechoslovakia and now professor at University of California. Benes, who taught at the 1949 summer session, will give three-hour courses on "International Politics" and "Comprehensive Study of Modern Communication." The latter will deal with the drama of diplomacy, underground communications and espionage.

Dr. Leland J. Gordon, head of the economics department at Denison university in Ohio, will teach

"Economics for Consumers" and "Labor Economics." Gordon is well-known as a labor arbitrator. A course in "Student Personnel Administration" is to be taught by Paul Potter, vice principal of Eugene high school and former president of Oregon Guidance association.

Public lectures are slated by Gordon for June 28 and July 26 and by Benes for July 12. The music school also is to give a public program.

Extra-curricular activities will include school picnics at the beach July 22 and at Silver Falls state park June 30 and the educational department picnic July 28.

While educational courses will be emphasized and many teachers are expected as students, Dr. Martin, head of the education department and director of graduate studies, said the session will offer a broad liberal arts program.

Youngsters Treated for Minor Hurts

A cut nose, a gashed hand, a lacerated knee and a scalp wound, each belonging to a different Salem youngster, were patched up Wednesday by the city first aid squad, with assists from local physicians.

About 8 p.m. the first aid squad went to Olinger playground for the first time during the current summer season and found 10-year-old Everett Stewart, 1160 N. 16th st., with a scalp wound. Everett said he had been struck with a rock.

In less than 10 minutes, the squad moved to 2330 Lee st. where Edwin Good, 17, had incurred a two-inch laceration in his hand. He was testing a knife on a blade of grass when the knife slipped.

Wednesday afternoon 12-year-old Phyllis Clatterback, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. M. B. Clatterback, 999 Locust st., tripped on the steps of the First Baptist church and incurred a lacerated knee.

And 7-year-old Jenalta Farse, Salem route 6, suffered a gashed nose at her home in the morning. She was playing on a swing, and the swing broke.

All the youngsters were advised to see physicians after preliminary patching.

Budworm Kill Tops Minimum Requirements

Kill of the spruce budworm, resulting from control operations of the budworm infestation on 27,913 acres of timber in the so-called Roseburg-Springfield area, ranged from 96.3 per cent to as high as 99 per cent in various plots recently checked, the state forestry department estimated Wednesday.

Forestry officials said this was far beyond the minimum which is accepted as adequate control.

Estimates were based upon inspections made just prior to treatment and then two weeks following spraying. Sixteen-inch specimens of twigs were taken prior to treatment and a count made of the budworms. This was repeated two weeks following treatment and the results indicated an average effectiveness of 97.5 per cent.

In treating the area, 29,500 gallons of DDT were used. Total cost of the project was \$24,212.41, or .865 per acre.

Dr. Huffman Gets Research Scholarship

Dr. Norman Huffman, head of the department of religion at Willamette university, received word Wednesday he had been awarded a \$5,000 fellowship in the professional division under the Fulbright act, to do research in the history of religion, attached to the University of Rome.

Three weeks ago an identical fellowship was granted to his wife, for research in 19th and 20th century Italian art, also attached to the Rome university.

Dr. Huffman and Mrs. Huffman will leave October 13 to launch their research projects.

Dr. Huffman received his training in paleography from the world famous authority, Kirsopp Lake, at Harvard. In Rome he will examine Greek and Latin manuscript.

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
