#### Church Day Set Sunday Near Scio

SCIO, June 15 — Annual Providence day will be observed Sunday, June 18, in the church of that name, 7 1/2 miles southeast of Scio. The afternoon service will begin at 2 p. m.

The historical church and memories of the place it held in pioneer days' history in this part of Oregon and the northwest are recalled by many people because of Annual Providence day.

During the day, Job Powell, pioneer teacher and circuit rider, will be honored. A monument to him was erected many years ago in front of the church yard and stands today as a historical marker.

Usual Sunday services will be at 10 a. m., Sunday school at 10:45 a. m. with a basket lunch following. A song service will open the afternoon program.

ALBANY—Mrs. Nellie E. Isom, 61, died at the family home near Halsey early Wednesday morning, June 14. Mrs. Isom had been in failing health the past several months. Funeral services under the direction of the Fortmiller-Fredericks morticians will be held from the Halsey Christian church at 8:30 o'clock Saturday, June 17. Rev. W. O. Jones of Halsey and Rev. J. M. Shelley of Eugene will officiate. Burial will be in the Alford cemetery.

Nellie Bond was born in Halsey December 5, 1888, a daughter of the late Austin Bond, and Louise Warmouth Bond, and had spent her entire life in or near Halsey. On June 10, 1908, in Halsey, she was married to Elbert Isom. Mrs. Isom was a well known teacher of Linn county, and had taught in the public schools of Halsey, as well as the rural schools of Alford, Porter, Powell, Lake Creek and Brandon, retiring from teaching a year ago. She was a member of Charity Grange; Vine Maple Circle, Neighbors of Woodcraft; Purit Rebekah lodge; and of the Christian church, and was active in each.

In addition she had for many years been correspondent for the Halsey community for the Eugene Register-Guard, the Albany Democrat-Herald, and the Halsey Journal.

Surviving besides her widower, are two children, Carl Isom of Tillamook, and Mrs. Beverly Meadows of Florence; her mother Mrs. Louise Bond of Albany, two brothers Frank Bond of Harrisburg and Lester Bond of Salem, and two sisters Mrs. Grace Sicksels of Halsey and Mrs. Vera Howard of Albany, and three grandchildren.
