

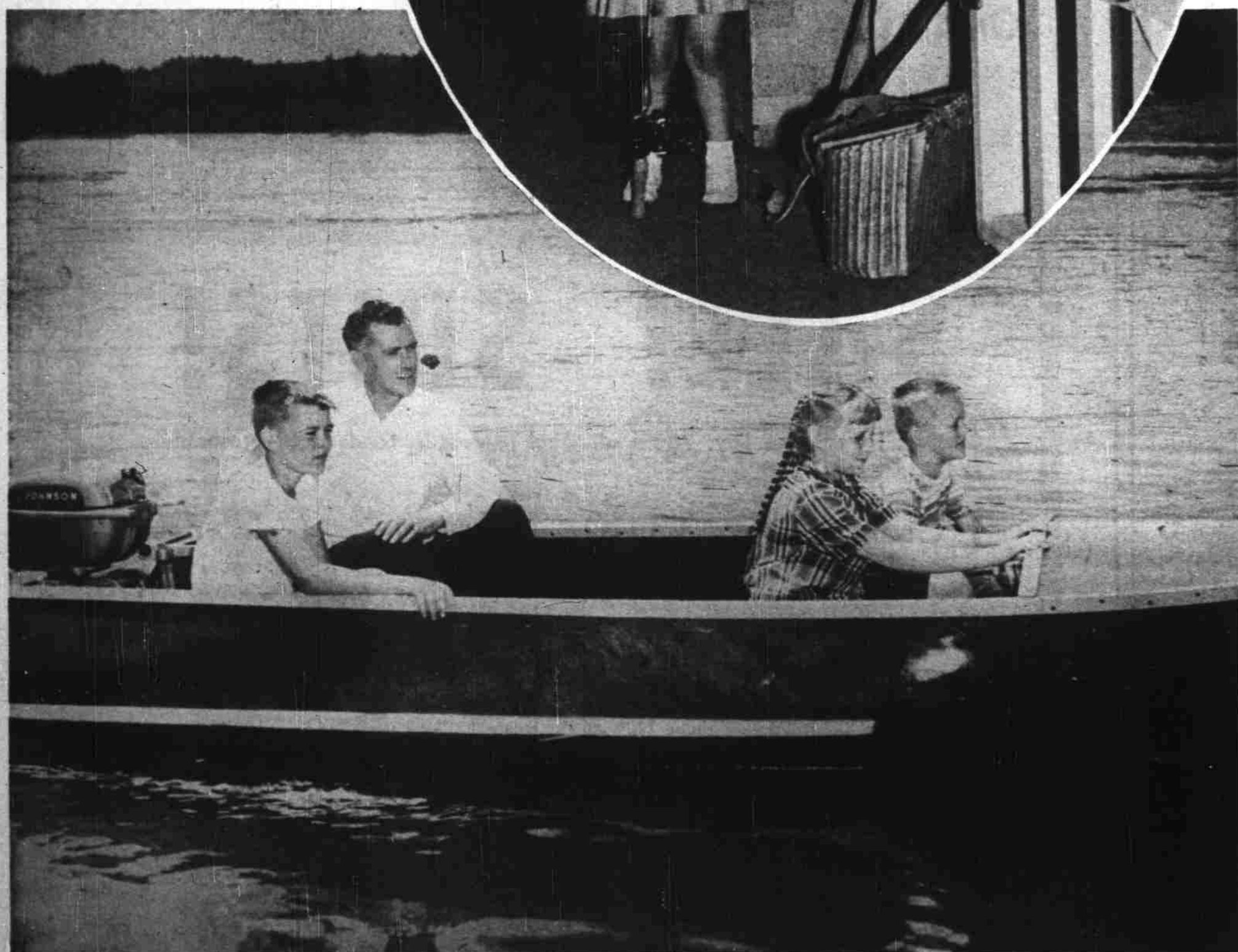
## FATHER'S WILL REIGN AS KING TODAY...
