

County Issues 78 Fireworks Sale Permits

Sale and shooting of fireworks are legal outside cities and Salem area youths are wasting no time. Stands which opened this week are already doing a good business and shooting can be heard in several areas. The fireworks law passed at the last legislature permits sale and shooting of fireworks from June 20 to July 6 inclusive.

Operators of fireworks stands, outside the city boundaries, must obtain a \$5 permit from the Marion county clerk's office. Already 78 such permits have been sold, according to Clerk Harlan Judd. A total of 71 permits were sold last year.

Legislation concerning the sale and shooting of fireworks in Salem is still pending before Salem city council. The council has already passed a bill prohibiting sale and shooting within the city limits. But a measure modifying that order has been introduced and is to be acted upon Monday night.

Auto Plant Walkout Deadline Set Monday

DETROIT, June 22 (AP)—The CIO United Auto Workers today set 10 a.m. Monday as the deadline for a strike of 30,000 employees at the Briggs Manufacturing Co. Such a walkout would cut into production almost immediately at Chrysler Corp., where a 100-day strike ended May 4, and at Packard Motor Car Co. Briggs, with nine plants in Detroit and one in Evansville, Ind., is a major producer of automobile bodies.

Four Wounded In Tennessee Strike Violence

MORRISTOWN, Tenn., June 22 (AP)—Strike violence exploded in to gunfire at the American Enka corporation today. Four men were wounded, one critically. Squads of state highway patrolmen moved in swiftly and started making wholesale arrests. By tonight they had taken into custody and fingerprinted 75 men, all identified by the patrolmen as strikers.

Three non-striking workers were cut down this morning when they attempted to enter the rayon-producing plant, scene of sporadic disorders since the CIO textile workers union local 1054 struck 13 weeks ago for higher wages and other benefits.

A fourth man, identified as a striker, later was killed in the arm by a bullet near the city limits of Morristown, seven miles from the plant. Highway patrol squads raced to the sprawling plant after two outbreaks of shooting. They quickly restored order.

Fellowship Hears Etter

Development of world government through the United Nations and devotion of full energy to removing social, economic and political causes of war was the gist of a message to the Fellowship of Reconciliation brought to Salem by Orval Etter, San Francisco, secretary of the organization.

Etter attended the recent meetings on Church and War held at Detroit and attended by 400 delegates representing 17 denominations.

Thursday night's meeting of the Fellowship was held at the YWCA.

Ditched Plane Crew Sighted

TOKYO, Friday, June 23 (AP)—A superfortress with 11 men aboard was reported missing near Guam today and air force headquarters said two life rafts had been sighted 140 miles southeast of there. A headquarters announcement said it was believed all 11 were aboard the rafts.

A search plane from Guam, which sighted the survivors, dropped a life boat.

Reply to AFL Charge Issued By La Grande

LA GRANDE, June 22 (AP)—A charge made at the state AFL convention last week that La Grande firemen were getting poor treatment under the city manager system was denied today by the city commission president.

Francis Greulich, president of the city commission, took issue with the charge that La Grande firemen weren't getting the minimum 75 cents an hour salary. "The law doesn't go into effect until July 1," said Greulich, and after July 1 La Grande firemen are going to be paid more. Greulich called the AFL criticism "political." "It may be a forerunner of an attack on an attempt to set up a city manager form of government in Portland," he said.

701,202 People Live in Portland Metropolitan Area

PORTLAND, June 22 (AP)—The Portland metropolitan area has a population of 701,202. That takes in three counties in Oregon and one in Washington, but it wasn't a chamber of commerce gesture. The census bureau set up the tabulation and called it "greater Portland."

Here it is: Multnomah county, 468,571 (Portland 371,011); Clackamas county, 86,574; Washington county, 61,221, and Clark county, Washington, 84,836. The area's population increased nearly 49 per cent from 1940.

Investigation of Primary Ballot Expenses Due

WASHINGTON, June 22 (AP)—An official probe of campaign spending in the senatorial primaries in at least five states was announced today by Senator Gillette (D-Iowa).

Up for a check are the nominating elections in Florida, South Carolina, North Carolina, Pennsylvania, Illinois and possibly some other states from which complaints have been received. Gillette heads a privileges and elections subcommittee which is riding herd on this year's voting which will determine the holders of 36 of the senate's 96 seats.

In South Carolina the investigation will concern the expenditures of the state rights party — "Dixiecrat money," Gillette called it.

A formal statement on behalf of the committee served notice of the forthcoming investigations in Pennsylvania, North Carolina, Florida and Illinois. Gillette told a reporter later that the committee will send staff workers into South Carolina within a few days to check on spending by the states rights. Numerous complaints have been received about activities there, he said.

Navy to Build Plane Carrier

WASHINGTON, June 22 (AP)—The navy has been given a go-ahead to build a flush-deck aircraft carrier similar to the one Defense Secretary Johnson halted on the ways last year.

A high navy official who disclosed this tonight said work on the new type carrier would not start until next year, however. He reported that the joint chiefs of staff had given clearance for the project and that Johnson had agreed "in principle."

Flying Plates, or Maybe Umbrellas, Seen in Portland

PORTLAND, June 22 (AP)—Well, the flying whatzits are back again, and this time they look like dinner plates instead of saucers. The weather bureau, less excited, thinks they might have been weather balloons.

Several Portlanders reported seeing "three somethings" last night. "It was like a dinner plate," said Miss Edna Basom, "but the underside was ribbed, like an umbrella. We saw six ribs anyway." Others thought the whatzits looked like balloons or Japanese lanterns. The weather bureau thought that sounded reasonable: it released a weather balloon, carrying a light, about 7:30 last night.

Tax Officials Claim Group Twisting Truth

The state tax commission sharply scolded a group of Clackamas county taxpayers for making "numerous misstatements" in connection with recent protests over the assessment rate in that county. In a statement which also rebuked the press for not printing "factual reports," the state officials said:

"The commission resents that 'Gestapo methods of moral suasion' were charged to the commission by the Clackamas county taxpayers league." Following the protests by taxpayers of rates set by County Assessor Rufus Wood, the state sent six appraisal engineers to the area to make surveys. The statement went on to deny charges that the appraisers were checking "brick-by-brick" and that an undue amount of time was spent making the appraisals. It refuted claims that the state appraisers were not checking "typical" homes by pointing out that the state was not making a general survey. The tax commission has ordered a hearing on the subject of appraisals to be held at Oregon City next Wednesday.

Pearson to Back Flegel, Demos Told

One-hundred per cent support of Austin Flegel in his bid for the governorship was promised Thursday night by Walter Pearson, state treasurer and opponent of Flegel's in the democratic primary election last May.

Pearson spoke at a reorganization meeting of the Marion county central committee which was also attended by Flegel and Howard Latourette.

Flegel also addressed the meeting and warned precinct leaders that elections are not won on registration figures. He promised to give "Oregon a governor they would not be ashamed of."

"Oregon needs a senator who is on speaking terms with the president," Howard Latourette, democratic candidate for the senate position now held by Wayne Morse, said.

In the business session, Luis Martin-Lally was reelected chairman of the Marion county democratic central committee by unanimous vote. Mrs. Roy Hewitt was elected vice-chairman. Other officers elected were Mrs. Alvin Whitlaw, secretary; P. W. Hale, treasurer; alternates to state central committee, Andrew Burk and Betty Templeton; George L. Becker, congressional committeeman; and Mrs. Lawrence Koch, Donald French, Allison Jones and Mrs. Earl Reynolds were elected to the district nominating committee.

Newly elected precinct committeemen and women presented their credentials and were installed at the meeting which was held at the 182 N. Commercial st. headquarters.

Lena Horne Said Married to White Musical Director

PARIS, June 22 (AP)—The secret marriage of Lena Horne, Negro singer, and Lennie Hayton, MGM musical director, was announced today by Miss Horne's manager, Ralph Harris.

Harris said the couple had kept the wedding quiet for professional reasons. It took place in Paris two years ago, he said. Miss Horne has been singing at a Paris night club. She is also under MGM contract, occasionally singing in a musical.

Hayton, who is white, won an academy award last year for his direction of the film version of the musical "On the Town."

Firms to Cut Payments to Accident Fund

Employer contribution rates to subject firms insured by the state industrial accident commission will take a sharp drop on July 1, this year, with an estimated saving of \$1,000,000 during the next fiscal year, the commission announced Thursday.

The basic industries of general farming and lumbering will experience the largest savings. This is partly because of the larger payrolls and establishment of effective safety programs, it was reported.

Reductions in contribution rates will apply to 277 industrial and trade classifications of Oregon industry or business. Only 78 classifications did not qualify for reductions.

Under the experience rating provision all employers subject to the act can qualify after one calendar year of favorable accident experience for reductions from 10 per cent to 50 per cent established base rates.
