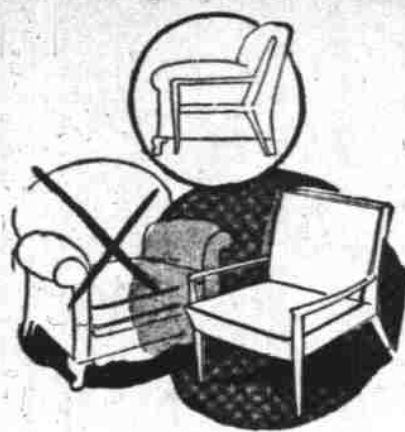

Today's smaller chairs chase old-fashioned mammoths out of the picture. For one thing, you can't buy comfort for the cubic foot. The stuffed-to-bursting chair may be unwilling to give in to your curves or it may be so marshmallow soft it's no support and is hard to get out of. A much smaller chair can be more comfortable than a big one because it's the pitch of the back of the chair and the relation of the back and arms to the seat, as well as the stuffing, that makes a chair comfortable. The balloon-big chair must be crossed off the list, too, because it doesn't belong in today's smaller rooms. Don't be misled because you think the big chair looks more luxurious. You can spoil a room that is well-designed in every other way by just that one false move—crowding it with too-big upholstered pieces. Give the new smaller chairs a sit-down test. WASHINGTON, June 27—(AP)—House here voted 213 to 72 to override President Truman's veto of a bill authorizing pay raises for World War II veterans in the postal service.

If the senate should follow the house's example, the measure would become law despite Mr. Truman's objections.
