MRS. KING WINS HONOR

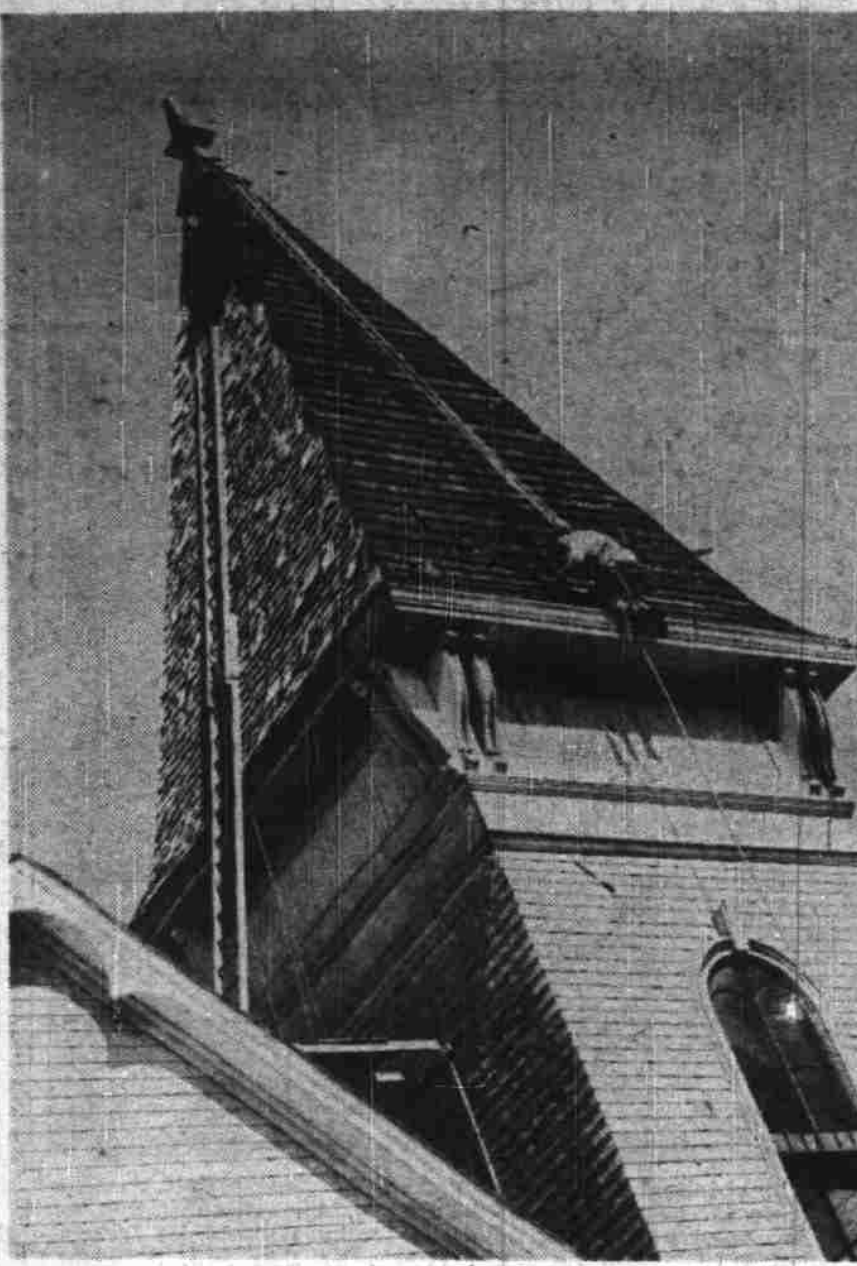
