

**Exalted Ruler Stock Market**

**Goes to New Low for 1950**

NEW YORK, July 12—(AP)—The stock market plunged to a new 1950 low today in one of the worst breaks since intervention in Korea.

Jittery traders dumped stock on the market in two waves of selling. Key issues were pounded down \$1 to around \$4 a share.

The market was already weakened by a series of selling attacks which in less than three weeks have hacked off roughly \$8,000,000,000 from the paper value of all stocks listed on the exchange.

Twice today orders poured into the exchange so rapidly that the high-speed ticker was left behind in reporting transactions on the floor of the exchange.

A midday effort to halt the slide was only temporarily successful. Nearly 300 issues sold at new lows for 1950 during the day. Closing prices were at or near the lows of the session.

Sales crossed the 3,000,000-share mark for the second day in a row. Turnover of 3,200,000 shares compared with 3,250,000 Tuesday.

The Associated Press average of 60 stocks cracked 1.6 to 70.8, a bottom since Dec. 21 last year. Three weeks ago the market was cruising around a four-year peak.

Today's war news was scarcely calculated to do anything but deepen confusion and strengthen pessimism.
