6-Point Fight With Inflation Set by Eccles

SALT LAKE CITY, July 18—(AP)—Marriner S. Eccles of the federal reserve board said today dangerous inflation is developing rapidly because of the Korean crisis.

In a statement he proposed the inflation be checked through taxes, stricter credit control and reduction of civilian demand for goods.

Eccles, a member of the federal reserve board of governors and former Utah banker, suggested this fiscal program for the government:

- 1—Make no reduction in taxes this year.
 - 2—Reimpose a corporation excess profit tax of 75 per cent on all net earnings above 10 per cent of the first \$5,000,000 of invested capital and 8 per cent on any balance, allowing a \$5,000 exemption of earnings subject to tax.
 - 3—Request organized labor to make no demands for wage increases while the excess profit tax is in effect.
 - 4—Close tax loopholes.
 - 5—Increase second and third class postal rates enough to meet post office department deficits.
 - 6—U. S. treasury to offer non-bank investors long term non-market bonds with 15-year maturity interest rate of 2½ per cent.

Demonstration Set Thursday On Flax Work

A combined inspection of flax varieties and a flax-pulling demonstration has been scheduled near Salem for Thursday afternoon at 2 o'clock by U. S. department of agriculture and Oregon State college flax specialists.

The demonstration will be held on the Jack Chapin farm at Mission Bottom, seven miles northwest of Salem on the Mission road. Several different varieties of fiber Chapin farm in commercial-size plots for experimental use.

ings may observe them and have them explained by the fiber flax specialists.
