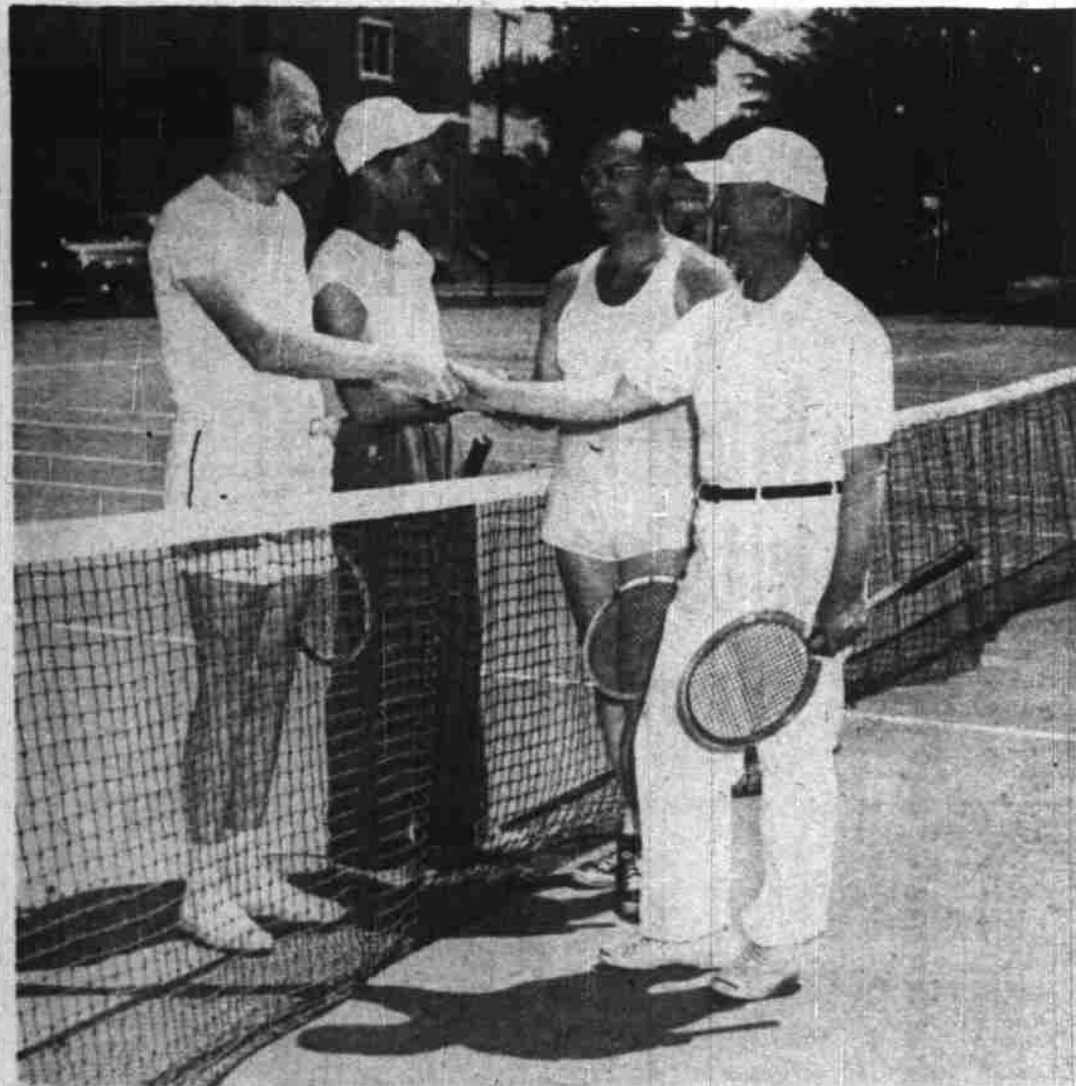

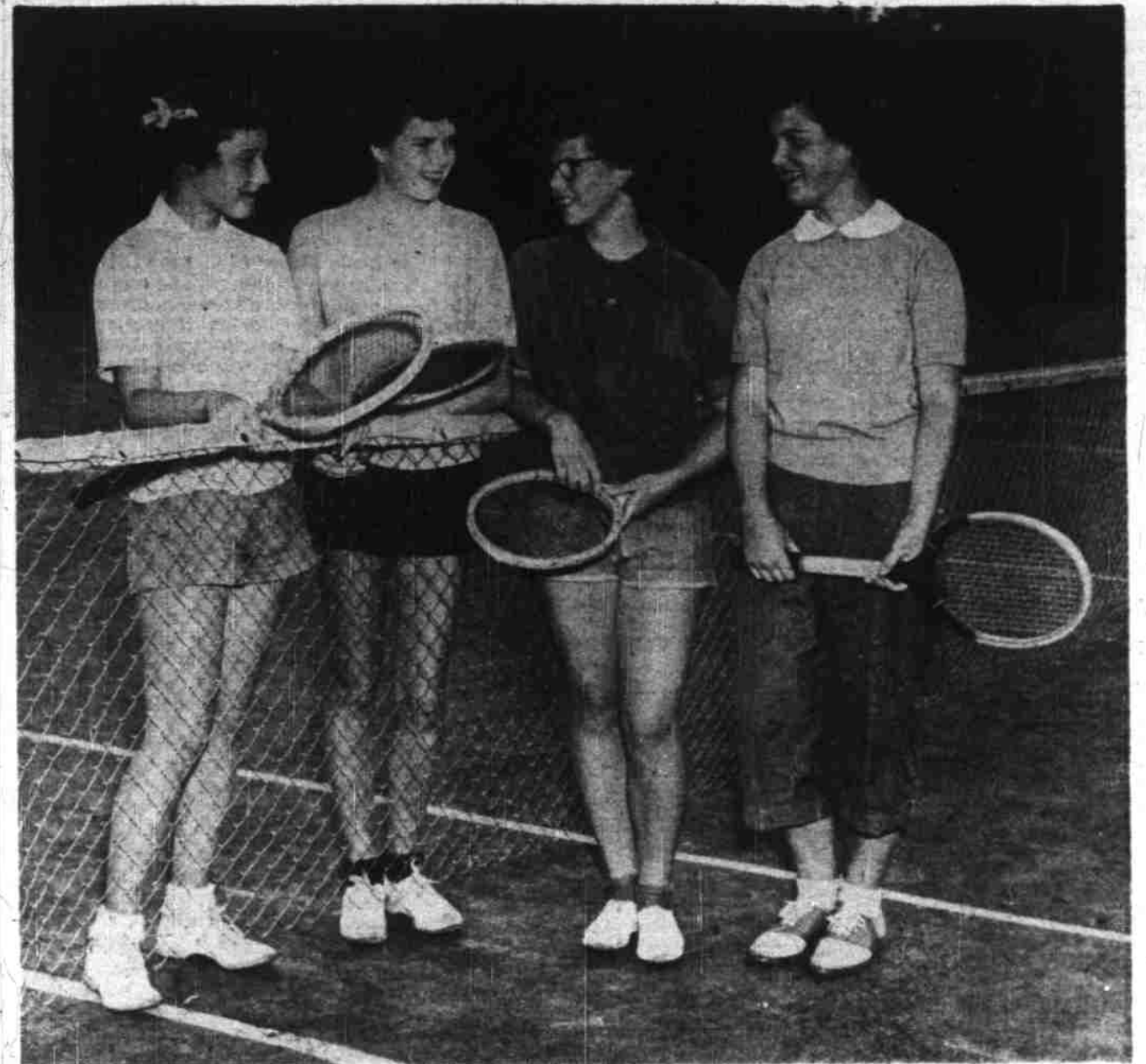
A Dinner Is Planned

The young Mrs. Burlingham was Patricia Rouse of Olympia before her marriage in June.

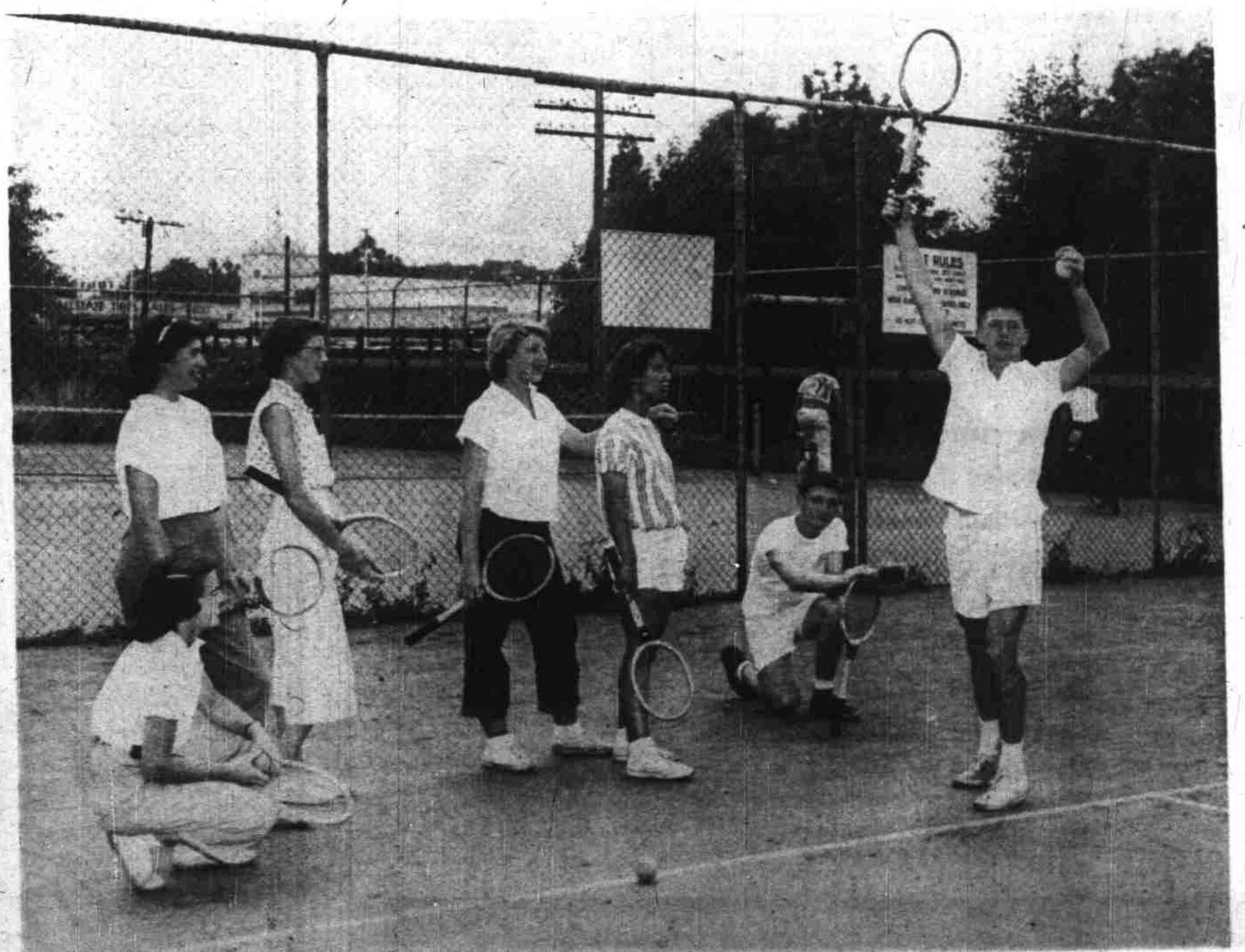
In the receiving line with Mrs. Burlingham will be the honor guest and her mother, Mrs. Willard Rouse of Olympia.
