New Plastic-coated Cloth, Simulating Hand-woven Grass, Now on Market

A new plastic coated cloth, simulating the hand-woven grass cloth made by Javanese natives, is on the market for summer home decoration and other all-weather use. The fabric has special flake markings to achieve the hand-woven effect. The material is a vinyl resin cloth, durable and more highly styled than the plain plastics which resemble leather.

The cloth is most versatile, being of light enough weight for wall covering, yet strong enough, because of its cotton base, for

slipcovers and upholstery. You will be seeing it in dining rooms, complementing reed or rattan furniture. This is the type of furniture that is used in some parts of the country for all-year use. The 50-inch wide plastic coated cloth comes in green, tile red, ciel blue, canary, red, grey, turquoise, ivory, chartreuse and tobacco shades.

A new synthetic textile fiber is now being tried out on an experimental scale. It will be interesting to watch for Fiber V, as the material is called. Limited quantities are being tested in window curtains, blouses, sport shirts, sewing thread and summer suits for general consumer use. In the industrial field, the fiber is being used on a small scale for such products as fire hoses. The new fiber has high tensile strength and high resistance to stretching, both wet and dry. It has good resistance to chemical bleaches and abrasion, launders easily, dries quickly and can be heat set.

Planes Carry War Against North Korea

TOKYO, Sunday, July 23 — (AP) Superfortresses bombers carried the brunt of the air war against the North Koreans Saturday as bad weather drastically limited activity, far east air force headquarters announced today.

The big Boeings of the far east bomber command ranged north of the 38th parallel, dropping more than 100 tons of high explosives, a communiqué said. The weather necessitated radar bombing results will not be known until reconnaissance planes report later. The weather allowed ground-supporting allied fighters to make only a single effective mission around the Taejon front, the communiqué said. Fifth air force jets hit 13 trucks, six horse-drawn artillery pieces and two other vehicles.

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A-bomb Expert Testing Out B-47 Stratojet

WICHITA, July 22 — (AP) — The key officer in the atom bombing of Hiroshima is in charge of a service test program for the B-47 stratojet bomber here, it was revealed today.

Col. Paul W. Tibbets, jr., will direct the test program "to determine operational capabilities of

the world's speediest bomber, it was announced.

Speedier production at lower cost were named as specific objectives.

The B-47, in production at Boeing Airplane Company's Wichita plant, is a swept-wing six-jet plane credited with speed in excess of 600 miles an hour. Experimental models were built at Boeing-Seattle.

The former chief of the strategic air division at U.S. Air Force headquarters, Washington, D.C., piloted the B-29 that dropped the A-bomb on Hiroshima.

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
