

Call for Active War Effort Closes Machinists' Meeting

After taking a slap at communist Korea, the western states conference of union machinists completed its business sessions and adjourned here Tuesday.

The resolution called on "government, labor and industry and all citizens to actively prosecute the threat to world peace. It condemned the actions of 'Red Korea and those supporting' it and commended President Truman for his 'prompt and courageous decision' in opposing the aggression.

Coos Fire Destroys Bridges, Rail Cars

COOS BAY, July 25 (AP)—A railroad bridge and six rail cars loaded with logs were damaged by fire that spread from grass here last night.

A Southern Pacific log train was changing engines when the blaze enveloped the bridge over Coalbank slough and the cars. Six first trucks from Coos Bay and North Bend extinguished the flames.

These bridge bonds, being issued pursuant to the Charter of the City of Salem, will be in denominations of \$1,000 each, dated August 1, 1950, and they will mature serially in numerical order, as follows:

Provided, however, that the bonds of said issue maturing on or after August 1, 1950 may be called and redeemed upon the payment of the face value thereof, with accrued interest, on August 1, 1955, or any other interest-paying date thereafter. Both principal and interest shall be payable at the office of the city treasurer of the City of Salem, Oregon. Interest will be paid semiannually on February 1 and August 1, of each year.

Each proposal must specify in a multiple of 1/4 of 1% the rate or rates of interest not exceeding 3% per annum, which the bonds are to bear. Said bonds will be sold for not less than 90% of the par value and accrued interest.

Each bid, except bids submitted by the State of Oregon or any sinking fund of the City of Salem, must be accompanied by a certified check for 2% of the par value of the bonds, made payable to the city as a guarantee of good faith. Bids submitted by mail should be addressed to the undersigned at the city hall in Salem, Oregon.

The right to reject any and all bids is reserved by the City of Salem. The prior legal approving opinion of Messrs. Winfree, McCulloch, Shuler & Bayre, Portland, Oregon, will be furnished the successful bidder.

Thomas Loses Bid for Parole

WASHINGTON, July 25 (AP)—J. Parnell Thomas, former New Jersey congressman who headed the House un-American activities committee during a stormy two years, lost his bid for parole from a federal prison Monday.

Charged with padding his office payroll, Thomas was sentenced to serve six to 18 months. He has served seven and a half months.

The U. S. parole board gave no reason for rejecting his parole bid, but noted that no arrangements have been made for paying a \$10,000 fine imposed on Thomas when he was sentenced last December 9.

Liquor Funds Given County

A quarterly distribution of \$67,990 in liquor privilege taxes to cities and counties was announced Tuesday by Secretary of State Earl T. Newbry.

Newbry said the distribution was based on 1940 population because the official 1950 census had not been announced when the tabulation was prepared.

County apportionments include: Clackamas \$2,213, Lane \$2,342, Linn \$1,013, Marion \$1,983, Multnomah \$2,868, Polk \$748, Yamhill \$1,050.
