Reverse Tax Policy Advised By Professor

Taxes should have been increased rather than lowered after World War II, Dr. Leland J. Gordon, visiting professor of economics at Willamette university stated this week.

Gordon said tax increases would have evened the nation's economic cycle and would have helped prevent another major depression. "Controls must be placed on our economy if depression is to be avoided," he said.

The professor said that every economic "boom" did not necessarily have to be followed by a "bust" but said the solution lies in "education of the public." If the nation doesn't act soon to stop inflation we may be headed for a bust, Gordon stated.

Guard Reserve Units Due in 25 Oregon Cities

PORTLAND, July 27 (AP)—Twenty-five Oregon cities will have units of the national guard reserve, officials disclosed today.

It is intended to recruit two regiments with a total strength of about 4,000 men. One would have headquarters in Portland, the other in Salem.

Companies will be formed in Portland, Salem, Forest Grove, Hillsboro, St. Helens, Astoria, Tillamook, LaGrande, Baker, Pendleton, Ontario, Eugene, McMinnville, Dallas, Woodburn, Oregon City, Lebanon, Cottage Grove, Springfield, Albany, Corvallis, Medford, Ashland, Grants Pass and Roseburg.

The reserve would replace the national guard should the guard be called to service.

State Pushing Delinquent Tax Account Audit

Satisfactory progress is being made by the state income tax division in auditing accounts of delinquent corporations and individuals, Tax Commissioner Ray Smith reported Thursday.

Smith said additional activities of his department were made possible by action of the 1949 legislature in appropriating funds for employment of more field auditors.

"Our records show that collections of delinquent accounts have far exceeded the cost of auditing," Smith averred, "with the result that the state has benefitted materially." In many cases accounts of large corporations and individuals owing the state income taxes have not been audited for several years because of insufficient operating funds.

Cure for Cows Colds Claimed In Tillamook

Three years of worrying with "summer colds" among dairy cattle of Tillamook county herds appears to have paid off with a likely cure, veterinarians in that region reported Thursday.

Dr. Andrew Lloyd, county veterinarian, and his partner, Dr. R. H. Peterson, report a small herd of seven cows had been given a combination of anti-histamine drugs and streptomycin. According to Associated Press reports Thursday the animals stopped their sneezing and snuffling and apparently are cured.

Dr. Lloyd said the afflicted animals did not die, but lost flesh and milk production fell off sharply.

Most of the herds afflicted were

in the area south of Hebo, where about a dozen herds — Holstein, Jersey and Guernsey — were suffering from the summer colds. Only occasionally are summer colds reported among the dairy cattle in the Willamette valley.
