Vet Ordered To Report for Draft Exam

At least one potential Marion county draftee is a veteran of World War II, it appeared Friday. On the list to report for pre-induction physical examination on August 22 is Udell McManus, 23, of 665 Breys ave., who served in the navy. The draft board would not disclose how many are under orders to report for physicals. Selective service officials said veterans' exemption from the present draft requires at least 90 days of wartime service or 12 months of service between 1945 and 1948. Certain scholastic training received under the military does not count as active duty in connection with the draft.

Guard Reserve Expansion Due

PORTLAND, July 28—(AP)—Maj. Gen. Thomas E. Rilea, adjutant general, said he had been ordered by Gov. Douglas McKay to activate a third regiment of the Oregon National Guard reserve. This would bring the state force to 6000 officers and men, Rilea said. The new regiment will be the 8th Oregon infantry. One battalion of the regiment will have headquarters and Company A at Bend, Company B at the Dalles, Company C at Klamath Falls and Company D at Burns, Rilea said. Locations of the other battalions have not been determined, and no commander has been chosen.

Nations Agree On Methods to Speed Arming

LONDON, July 28—(AP)—The civilian directors of the North Atlantic alliance announced a unanimous agreement tonight on ways to accelerate defense production in western Europe. The directors are deputy foreign ministers of the 12 member nations. They opened secret sessions here last Tuesday under the chairmanship of Charles Spofford of the United States. Details of the agreement were withheld. But Spofford told newsmen there have been tangible results in the drive to rearm the west against communism and the decisions are being sent to the member governments.

Pressure by North Koreans Still Strong

(Story also on page one) TOKYO, July 28—(AP)—The main weight of attack today by nine North Korean divisions still was being exerted on the American sector of the front around Hwanggan, where heavy red attacks were launched yesterday. The North Koreans had driven into the hinge of the foot cavalry and 25th division positions. Whitehead reported from an advance command post that elements of the two American divisions cleaned out the red infantry in the gap and straightened the allied defenses to the original line. Attacks that the front settled down to relative quiet Friday.

Added Army Draft Request Said Possible

WASHINGTON, July 28—(AP)—There is a strong possibility that the army may issue another draft call this year. This became apparent today after Chairman Vinson (D-Ga.), of the house armed services committee gave this breakdown on the army's plans: Present strength: 594,000. Proposed strength: 834,000. Recruits needed: 240,000. Yesterday the army asked selective service to draft 50,000 men in September, another 50,000 in October. This will leave the army 140,000 men short of its goal unless there is a flood of volunteers. Vinson talked with reporters after Gen. J. Lawton Collins, army chief of staff, had explained the army's plans to the committee. The army expects to get \$3,000,000,000 of the \$10,500,000,000 in extra military funds which President Truman asked for Monday. More than half the army's share—\$1,651,000,000—will go for tanks, guns and field artillery. It is understood that a considerable amount will go for a new anti-aircraft gun, the Skysweeper.

U. S. to Purchase Surplus Sugar

WASHINGTON, July 28—(AP)—The United States may buy surplus sugar in Puerto Rico, the Virgin Islands and Hawaii to assume a plentiful supply for needs. The agricultural department said it is entering negotiations for purchase of 250,000 short tons. Yesterday the department announced that it had arranged to buy a Cuban surplus of 600,000 tons.

Farmer Killed By Own Whip

BLOOMFIELD, Mont., July 28—(AP)—A farmer killed himself with his whip while trying to drive a bull into a stall. Coroner C. Kock gave this account today: Mike M. Knels, 45-year-old northeastern Montana farmer was trying to get a bull into a barn stall yesterday. He popped the bull whip. It encircled a post. A one-inch piece of wire broke off the whip's tip. The fragment flew back to Knels, striking him while his upraised right hand still held the whip. The wire penetrated Knels' right lung and lodged in his spine. Knels is survived by his widow and four children.
