

Ponder Choice At Arlington

11 Nags Entered In Handicap Run

CHICAGO, July 23.—(AP)—Eleven thoroughbreds, including Calumet Farm's Ponder, 1949 Kentucky Derby winner, today were entered in the \$83,400 Arlington handicap at Arlington Park tomorrow.

This mile and one quarter race, richest handicap east of the Rockies, winds up a successful 36-day meeting. The racing scene shifts to Washington Park, Arlington's companion track, Monday for 31 days winding up on Labor Day.

Victory in the handicap will net the winning owner \$47,000 with \$20,000 for second, \$10,000 for third and \$5,000 for fourth.

Ponder, at odds of 2-1, probably will go to the post favorite. This stretch running four-year-old carrying top weight of 128 pounds, will give Calumet Farm its final chance to win a stake at Arlington, an achievement which the fabulous Ben Jones, Calumet trainer, has failed to accomplish this season.

Two invaders from the east, Brandywine Stable's Cochise (122) and Alfred G. Vanderbilt's Loser Weeper (116) will be well backed tomorrow by the expected crowd of 27,000. So will Walter Farm's Volcanic, which has been training exceptionally well.

Tom Gray's 3-year-old colt, Oli Capitol (111), which failed in the recent Arlington Classic stakes, will try to defeat older horses again. He did it in the Equipose mile, while carrying the same 111 pounds. Saturday's assignment is a much tougher one, however.

Tacoma Youth Medal Champ

SAN FRANCISCO, July 23.—(AP)—Young Jim McCarthy from Tacoma won the national junior medal play golf championship today with a score of 303. He was eight strokes ahead of his nearest competitors at the Lake Merced Golf club.

The tall 16-year-old youth shot rounds of 78-76-69-80 to win a title among which more than 2,000 young golfers contested in eliminations. Accurate iron shots, which carried him to a 69 in the third round of play yesterday, stood the 140-pound youngsters in good stead as he coasted to victory.

Floyd Addington, a slim Texan from Dallas, shot the best round of the final day's play, a 77, to boost himself into a tie for second place with Don Thornton of Los Angeles, who blew himself to a juicy 43 on the final nine holes. Addington had 78-76-79-77-311 and Thornton 77-79-74-84-311.

Ike's Brother Golf Winner

TACOMA, July 23.—(AP)—Wet, chilly weather hurt Ed Eisenhower's game today, but not enough to keep him from winning his third straight Washington State Senior Golf association championship.

The brother of famed general "Ike" Eisenhower, the 61-year-old Tacoman defeated "youngster" Warren Gilbert, 57, Mount Vernon, 5 and 4, in the 18-hole finals here today. Both are attorneys.

Gilbert was able to win only one hole, dropping an 8-foot putt for a par on the 12th, where Eisenhower chalked up a 39 on the first nine to hold a four-hole edge.
