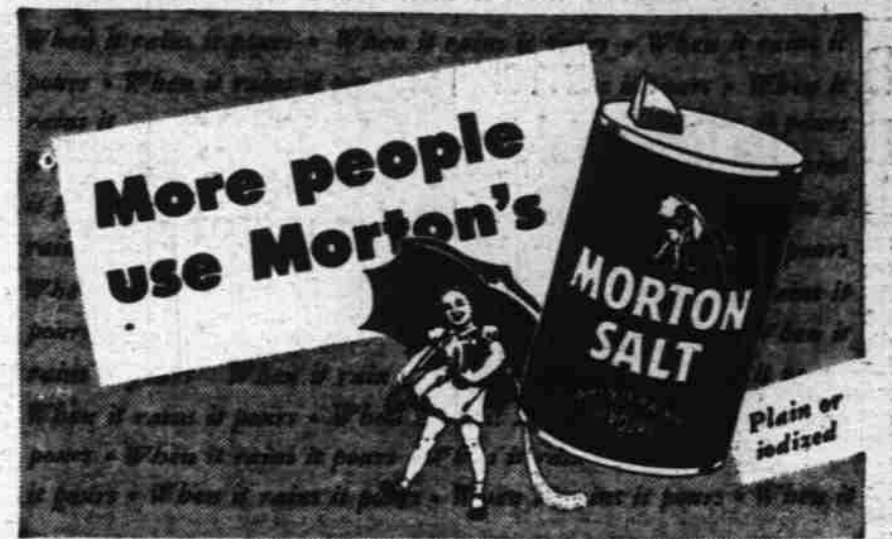
## Parents on Visit
