People from every state in the nation and from four foreign countries have witnessed the 1939 festival play of King Henry IV, Part One, Comedy of Errors, As You Like It, and Antony and Cleopatra. Festival officials predict over 20,000 people will see this year's Ashland event. The festival has received national publicity with writeups in Quick Magazine, Sunset, Theatre Art, Opera and Concert, Chrysler Events, and reviews in the San Francisco Chronicle and Seattle Times, in addition to Oregon newspapers.

Angus L. Bowmer, founding producing director, stated the talent this year has been outstanding and that the festival is growing rapidly with a sound financial foundation.

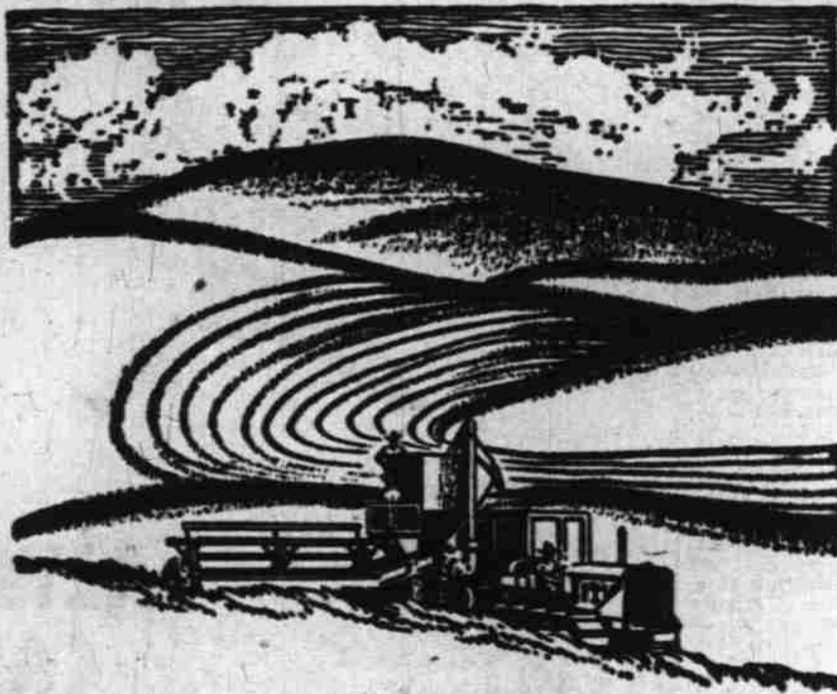
Committees Named

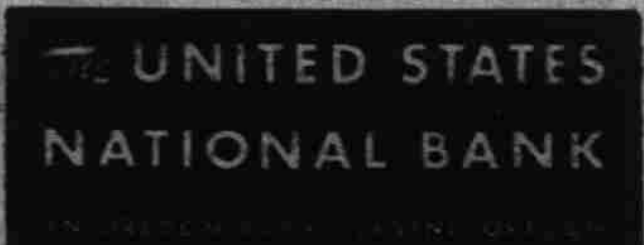
