ALBANY — Jess L. Bouvia, 60, died Aug. 21 as the result of heart trouble. Funeral services will be held from the Fisher Funeral Home at 10 o'clock Thursday morning, August 24. The Rev. Father E. Hyatt will officiate. Burial will be in Willamette Memorial park with graveside services being conducted by Albany post No. 10 of the American Legion of which Bouvia was a member.
 Bouvia, a resident of Albany the past nine years, made his home at the Albany hotel. He was seen alive Sunday, but was not noticed Monday and the landlord upon going to his room found him dead on his bed. Death was pronounced due to natural causes. He had been under a physician's care for a heart ailment.
 Born on Oct. 17, 1889, in Anthon, Iowa, Bouvia spent most of his life in Salt Lake state. In 1936 he moved to Coquille, and in 1941 to Albany.
