

# Grains Given Boost by Sales In Northwest

CHICAGO, Sept. 14 (AP)—Mills in the northwest bought a little wheat today, giving that grain a boost of around a cent on the board of trade. The rest of the market, not sharing in the mill demand, moved listlessly along to a mixed close.

Aside from the mill buying, demand in wheat was nothing to get excited about. However, the selling on improved Korean war news, noticeable in yesterday's market, did not re-appear in any volume today.

Wheat closed 1/4-1/2 higher, corn 1/2 lower to 1/4 higher, oats 1/4 lower to 1/2 higher, rye 3/4 to 1 cent higher, soybeans 1 cent lower to 1/4 higher and hard 5 to 30 cents a hundred pounds higher.

All grains sold off during the morning, but declines were limited to fractions everywhere but in soybeans.

After the market closed, the Canadian bureau of statistics issued its regular monthly crop report, which had been awaited with considerable interest. It forecast wheat production for all of Canada at 490,320,000 bushels, down 53,370,000 bushels from the previous report. Oats, rye and barley prospects also were lowered.

The drop in wheat did not come near some of the guesses of late last week, which put the loss at close to 100,000,000 bushels. Still the figures do not tell the whole story, because much of the wheat undoubtedly has been frosted and will be unfit for human consumption. More frosts were reported in Canada overnight.
