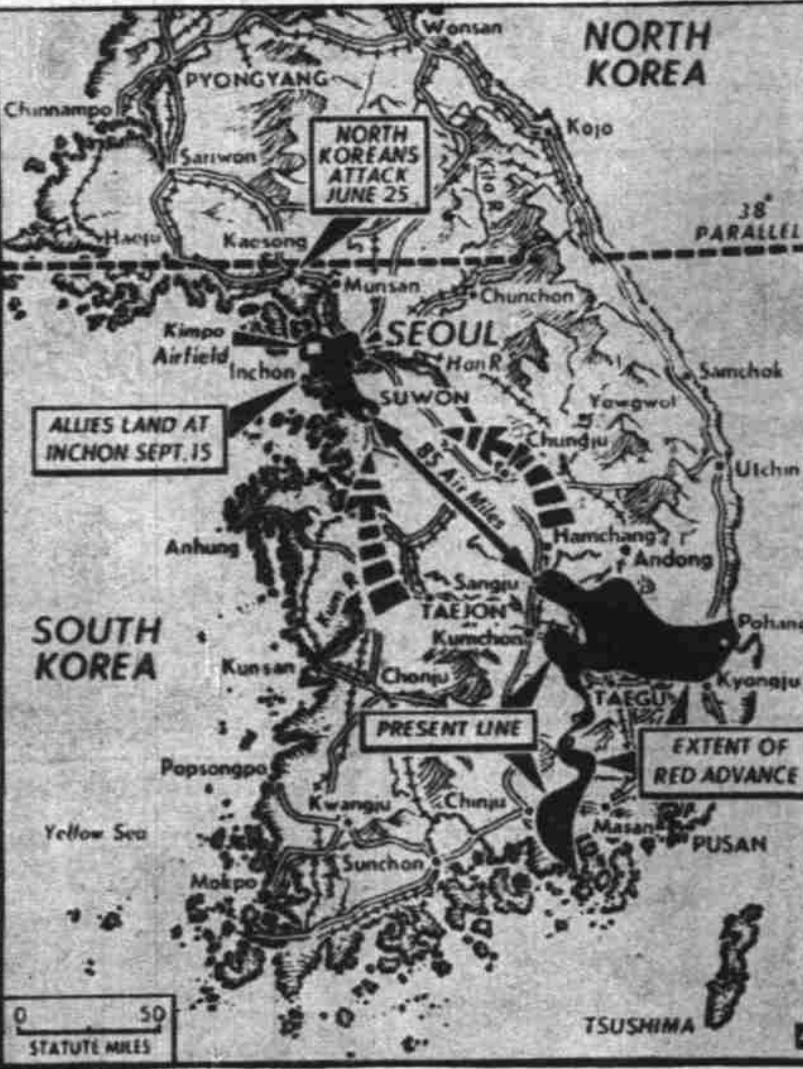

Morse Said 'Satisfied' with Anti-Red Law

ST. LOUIS, Sept. 24 (AP)—Senator Wayne Morse (R-Ore.) said tonight he was "satisfied" the anti-subversives law passed yesterday over President Truman's veto was constitutional.

He called the law "the best compromise that could be worked out." Morse said he felt some strong law was needed "on the books because there is a very real danger of sabotage in this country."

He added he voted for it because I made a careful study of it and satisfied myself it was constitutional, he declared.
