

### Mill Stream Ducking Out At Willamette

There'll be no more ducking of Willamette students down by the old Mill stream behind the campus, it appeared Friday.

Declaring the stream "grossly polluted" by sewage, Dr. Ralph Furvine, university health service director, recommended it be placed off-limits for college pranksters.

G. Herbert Smith, Willamette president, promptly announced that any student who threw another in Mill creek would be expelled from the university.

A toss into the stream has for years been the fate of male members of the losing class in Freshman Glee, annual campus music event.

The action followed a water analysis which revealed that Mill creek was contaminated with water which, if ingested, could result in typhoid fever and other serious diseases.

### Last of Voter Pamphlets in Mail Friday

Last of the 750,000 combined voters and measures pamphlets for the November 7 election were placed in the mails this week by the state elections bureau.

The law provides these pamphlets shall be mailed at least 15 days prior to the general election. Cost of printing and mailing the pamphlets was estimated at \$30,000.

All of the pamphlets, except those covering Multnomah and Marion counties, were printed in the state printing department here.

The Multnomah pamphlets were printed in Portland and the Marion county pamphlets in Salem.

Officials said in previous years approximately 7 per cent of the pamphlets were returned because the persons to whom they were addressed had moved without leaving a forwarding address.

This year the elections bureau refused to guarantee return postage with the result there will be a substantial financial saving to the state.

### Private Plane Brings Fiber Group to City

### Five-Power Peace Talks Gain Approval

LAKE SUCCESS, N. Y., Oct. 20—(AP)—The United States, Britain and France provisionally agreed today to take part in five-power peace talks, but Russia's expected insistence on Chinese communist participation could wreck the whole project.

U. S. Delegate John Foster Dulles and British Minister of State Kenneth Younger warned against false hopes of easy or early success even if the five ultimately get together around a conference table. They told the U. N. assembly's political committee the world's present tension stems from basic disagreements rather than from a lack of big power meetings.

While Russia has not yet participated in the 60-nation political committee's current debate, Soviet Foreign Minister Andrei Y. Vishinsky is expected to stick to his position on China when he makes his views known tomorrow.

Syria and Iraq have presented a resolution calling for consultations by the United States, Britain, France, Russia and China "on all problems which are likely to threaten world peace."
