were indecisive. The market started out on a forward slant. Progress was painfully slow during the morning. In the afternoon the general price level gently curved downward.




"They're not the best-looking boarders a man ever had." Hack Turner said one day, "and they've got awful tempers. But I've found it pays to have 'em around."
